## From the Principal

Where did the time go?! It's hard to believe that we are just a few weeks away from ending the 2017-18 school year! As June 19 draws nearer, it's important to remember that every day will still be packed with learning and growth opportunities. Please help your child stay focused on school in this busy time. We have many fun special events coming up, from field trips to guest speakers, as well as the usual meaningful learning that goes on in classrooms. As the school year ends, we prepare to say goodbye to some staff members, and to welcome new ones:

- Assistant Principal Katie Stone, whom we share with James Monroe Elementary, is leaving us to become the principal at Cooper Elementary School in Spokane. Our new half-time assistant principal is Annette Sternberg, whom we will share with Lowell Elementary. Annette started her career as a school administrator as Lowell's half-time assistant principal this year.
- Fourth-grade teacher Meredith White will be heading to Eisenhower Middle School to teach English language arts, technology, and art after three years at Jefferson.
- **Jarucia Jaycox** will be joining us as the fourth-grade Lighthouse teacher as **Sarah Lucas** moves up to fifth-grade Lighthouse. Jarucia comes to us from the Lake Washington School District, where she has spent four years teaching academic intervention groups in ELA and math to students in grades K-5.
- Developmental kindergarten teacher Melissa Wilkening-Joly is returning to the Edmonds School District after two years in Everett. We will welcome Amy Denham as our new DK teacher.
- Class configurations can still change, but at this point, we are planning on
  adding an additional fifth-grade class, and decreasing by one third-grade
  class. So, Ellen McClure is moving to fourth grade from third, and we
  will hire a new fifth-grade teacher.

I hope that the summer will be a time of continued learning for your child! One great way to do this is to participate in Everett Public Schools' summer reading program. Brochures describing the program and showing your child's summer reading goal will be mailed home with progress reports right after school ends. Jefferson's library will be open to support summer reading — checking out books, taking Accelerated Reader quizzes, etc. — from 10 a.m. to noon Wednesdays, June 27 to Aug. 22, with the exception of July 4. Students will also have access to AR quizzes from home over the summer, along with being able to use familiar websites such as IXL, i-Ready, and Keyboarding Without Tears.



Instead, you will be able to log in to the district's Home Access Center (HAC) to see your child's teacher. Please remember to bring an **original** birth certificate and utility bill with you when submitting kindergarten registration.

**Update your e-mail address with the office:** Providing us with an up-to-date e-mail will help us keep you current on school news, and relay information about your child.

**How to find out your child's 2018-19 teacher:** See the last two pages of the newsletter to find out how to sign up for the district's Home Access Center. This is where you will find out your child's teacher for the next school year in early September. You will not receive an automated phone call or e-mail with teacher assignments as you have in past years!

**Early dismissals from school:** When checking your student out early, please remember to have photo ID.

**Summer Reading Program:** Everett Public Schools looks forward to another successful year of its summer reading program. We are partnering with Everett Public Library and Sno-Isle Libraries again this year. Watch your school's website for details about this summer's program. Students will receive incentives for reaching their reading goals, and schools that have at least 75 percent of their students reach their reading goals will be recognized by the district.

**Stuff the Bus is coming!** A partnership coordinated by the Everett Public Schools Foundation with community organizations and businesses has become an annual effort to gather backpacks and school supplies to help our students in need start the year prepared. Last year, more than 1,900 students received backpacks filled with school supplies, and the Foundation has the same goal this year. Look for collection bins in businesses during the month of August and Durham

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buses parked outside local businesses **Aug. 17-19**. Each item collected helps prepare a student with tools needed to learn.

**Vaccinations for next year:** Now is the time to plan for the vaccinations your child will need before he or she enrolls next fall. Students over the age of 11 entering 6th grade require one booster dose of Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccine before the first day of the 6th grade. Students entering high school require two varicella vaccines before the first day of high school. We encourage you to obtain



these vaccinations this school year and report them to the school nurse or office staff at your child's school. We'll track that information in the school database, which will help you avoid getting calls and overdue letters in the fall.

**SBA scores are coming soon:** Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) scores will be available for all families and students this summer in the online Home Access Center (HAC). Families will also receive a hard copy in September. Find tools for parents to understand those SBA scores on the <u>district assessment website</u>. To access scores: <u>Instructions are online</u>. Innovation Expo June 6, 5-8 p.m.: Students and families will enjoy seeing and interacting at booths from every school in the district at this year's Innovation Expo June 6, 5-8 p.m., at Angel of the Winds (formerly Xfinity) Arena. Each school's booth is different and showcases something the students at that school are learning. The STEM competition is a favorite part of the event for many students and families. See the best student projects from around the district and hear what the students learned by doing them.

- 2. Click on the "Info" icon to access HAC to see transcript, test scores, attendance and more.




Home tab will show useful school links.
