Dear Jefferson Families,

Where did the time go?! It's hard to believe that we are just a week or so away from ending the 2016-17 school year! I have had a wonderful year at Jefferson, and I hope that your family has, too - whether it was your first year, your last year, or somewhere in between. Highlights of my first year here include getting to know children and their families; seeing students excited about learning; and working with our fantastic staff to improve the experience for everyone here. I'd like to thank each and every one of our families for their support of students, staff, and learning at Jefferson each day!

As the year draws to a close, we prepare to say goodbye to some staff members, and to welcome new ones:

- Assistant Principal Daniel Natividad, whom we share with Lowell Elementary, is leaving us to become Cedar Wood Elementary's full-time assistant principal. Our new half-time assistant principal is Katie Stone, who comes to us from the Lake Washington School District, where she has taught third and fourth grades as well as K-6 academic intervention.

- The first day of school for grades I-5 is Wednesday, Sept. 6.
- Kindergarten students begin school Monday, Sept. 11.
