Welcome back, Jefferson families. Just wanted to highlight a few things that you might find helpful:

1. If your child is in need of school supplies, we have backpacks. Please contact me or the front office and we will make sure your child gets one.

2. We have a small food pantry. Please let us know if at any time you need to access it. Also, we could use donations. You can drop off donations in the front office.

3. Attention fathers, uncles, grandfathers, significant others: Our Watch D.O.G.S. program starts in October. Important Safety Reminders

No dogs on campus: Only service animals are allowed on campus from 8:45 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. and during school events.

Student supervision: It is essential that students not be on campus without adult supervision. In the morning, supervision begins at 8:55 unless students are eating breakfast at school. Breakfast begins at 8:45. After school, supervision ends at 3:50 p.m., and students still waiting to be picked up are taken into the office to contact parents.

Parking lot reminders: The Jefferson parking lot is a very busy place! Please consider parking at Eastmont Park & Ride and walking to school. Whenever you are in the parking lot, keep you speed to 5 MPH, follow the directional arrows, park only in marked spaces, use crosswalks, observe Safety Patrol and staff directions, and stay in your car unless parked in a marked spot. The back parking lot is for staff, buses, and district vehicles only.

Walking reminders: Stay on paths and sidewalks, use crosswalks, and follow Patrol and staff directions.

Biking reminders: Walk bikes on sidewalks, paths, and the blacktop area. Wear a helmet, and lock your bike. No scooters are allowed, and only those in grades 3-5 may bike to school unless with an adult.

Visitor/volunteer reminders: You must have district clearance to volunteer. To apply, visit http://www.everettsd.org/domain/1 452. Arrange volunteering and visits with the teacher in advance. Sign in at the office and wear a visitor sticker at all times.

Access to public records

Many records and documents in Everett Public Schools are available to the public. Parents and other citizens have the right to ask the school district to view or have copies made of records defined as "public" under state and federal laws including their own student's records and public records about discipline of school employees.

Everett Public Schools public records requests are handled by the district's finance and business services office. Records can be requested by writing that office at PO Box 2098, Everett, WA 98213, sending an email to *publicrecords@everettsd.org* or calling 425-385-4150.

Your student's records are confidential

Everett Public Schools takes very seriously its duty to protect student records and privacy. Student transcripts and other education-related records are protected by multiple security measures. Only those teachers, administrators and other staff members who work directly with the student and have an educational need to know about the student have access to individual student records. Staff members are expected to maintain confidentiality about information contained in a student's records.

Vaccination requirements

Students in kindergarten through 12th-grade need 2 doses of Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or have a health care provider document that they have already had chickenpox. Review vaccination requirements for your child on the <u>Washington State Department of Health website</u>.

ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2017-18

Everett Public Schools' Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Early Learning. The five ECEAP sites within our school district are Garfield, Hawthorne, Lowell, Madison and Silver Lake elementary schools. Space is limited – apply early! Kids in Transition program in Everett Public Schools

The Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify as homeless under federal McKinney-Vento legislation. Students who lack a fixed, regular, or adequate nighttime residence may qualify. The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students' academic success and extra-curricular participation. We ensure homeless students have school supplies and provide tutoring or facilitate student participation in extended day or summer school classes. We help students participate in activities such as sports or clubs by paying required fees. KIT provides transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible.
