Hello Parents!

Happy New Year! We are very excited here at Lowell to welcome in 2020. We know it is going to be a year of success for our students. With the new year, we are taking time to review our common area behavior expectations by conducting a mid-year rodeo. A rodeo is when students tour the school on the first day back and stop at important common areas to review the expectations for that area. For example, classrooms stop by the bathrooms and have a refresher on the bathroom expectations of- go, flush, wash and leave. Or they visit the playground and are reminded to put away equipment at the end of recess and to always go to line up at the first whistle. Additionally, teachers are taking time our first week back to review their classroom behavior expectations. Each classroom has created a behavior matrix that reminds students of the expectations for each area of learning. For example, classrooms have expectations for sitting on the carpet or how to behave when sitting at their desk.

We feel it is important to review behavior expectations because when we do this staff and students are all on the same page and we are speaking a common language. When we did the rodeo at the beginning of the school year we found our school to be much more orderly and calm. We are looking forward to that same result with the mid-year rodeo. For the next few parent newsletters we will post the common area expectations so you can review them with your child at home. Below, is our first one, the common area expectations for bathrooms. - Need to have transportation to and from Lowell at your assigned times, and to and from EHS Civic Auditorium on Friday and Saturday.
- Commit to coming to <u>all</u> rehearsals and <u>both</u> performances

 *Unfortuately there are no exceptions (doctor appts, sports, etc) to the two statements above as we need all of the time to be ready! We only have one week!

Our timeline looks like this:

February 6th - Audition Permission Forms sent home in Thursday envelopes

February 14th - Permission forms need to be returned by noon to office

*Everyone who turns in a completed form **by** noon on February 14th **AND** who is present and on time on Audition Day gets to audition

February 27th - Reminder notes go home to all who are auditioning

March 2nd - Closed auditions after school; announcement of cast at 5:00

March 2nd - Rehearsals after school 2:50-7:20 with times depending on your assigned role. Lead roles usually stay late and are typically 4th and 5th graders.

March 6th - Performance at EHS Civic Auditorium at 6:30 pm

March 7th - Performance at EHS Civic Auditorium at 10:30 am

Paper registration will also be made available in the classroom.



Do you or your student have a concern about someone experiencing bullying or harassment? Or have you perhaps heard a rumor about someone bringing a weapon or drugs to school?


Report it! You can talk directly with your school's office or you can call, text or email your concern.
