Few things are better than relaxing on a summer day with a good book. Research overwhelmingly shows that reading over the summer break is essential to maintaining and improving a student's literacy levels.

With that in mind, we'd like to remind you of Everett Public Schools Summer Reading Program requirements and the opportunities available to your student.

Included in this brochure you will find your student's course level reading list and other information about our Summer Reading Program. Your student needs to read at least one book from their list. Then they may read as many age appropriate books of their choice.

Each time your student finishes a book, they should take an Accelerated Reader (AR) test for that book. They can link to AR tests on any connected device by visiting their school's district website. Students will be eligible for rewards after reading and passing AR tests for two books, three books, and more than three books.

The district has partnered with our local public libraries to ensure that copies of our listed books will be readily available both in print and in digital format.

We hope that your summer is full of joy and great reads!

Summer Reading Guidelines

1. All JHS students are required to read TWO books.
2. See notes for the English course you will be taking for details regarding the requirements and titles.
3. No English class at JHS? Read two age appropriate books of your choice.
4. Students must take an AR quiz for each book they read. If a quiz is not available, or you are not happy with your score, complete the Summer Reading Book Quiz located on the JHS library website.

Directions to Access AR

Between July 1, 2018 and August 31, 2018 go to <https://rdiweb.everett.k12.wa.us/> to take an **Accelerated Reader (AR)** test. Log in with your **six digit** student ID number and the same password you use at school. AR tests can be taken anywhere you have internet access.

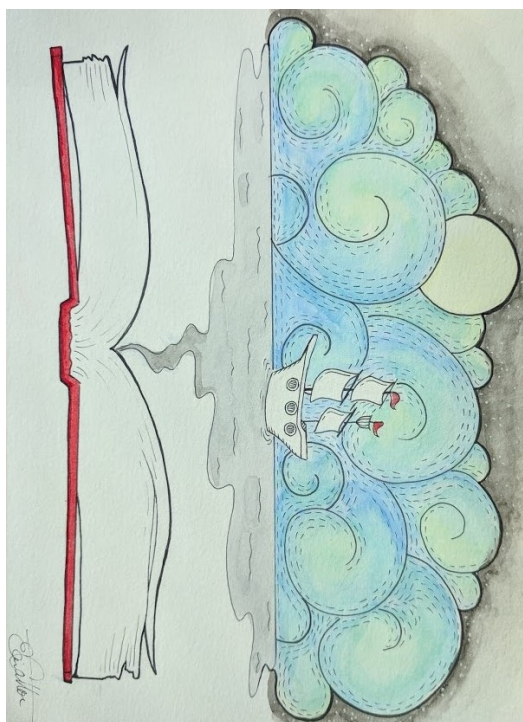
Reading Incentives

Students will receive rewards for reading two books, three books, and more than three books. An AR test or Summer Reading Book Quiz must be completed for each book read.

Two books—Name entered into a drawing for a variety of \$25 gift cards and recognition at a school assembly.

Three books—Name entered into a drawing for a variety of \$25 gift cards, recognition at a school assembly, name published in *The Daily Herald*, and name entered into a drawing for a free "Y" student membership.

More than three books—All of the above plus your name entered into a drawing for a Kindle Tablet.
