

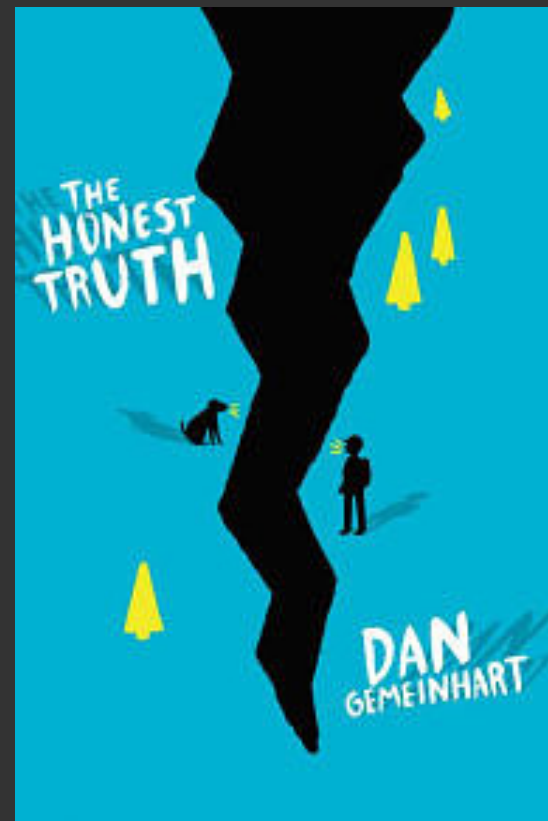

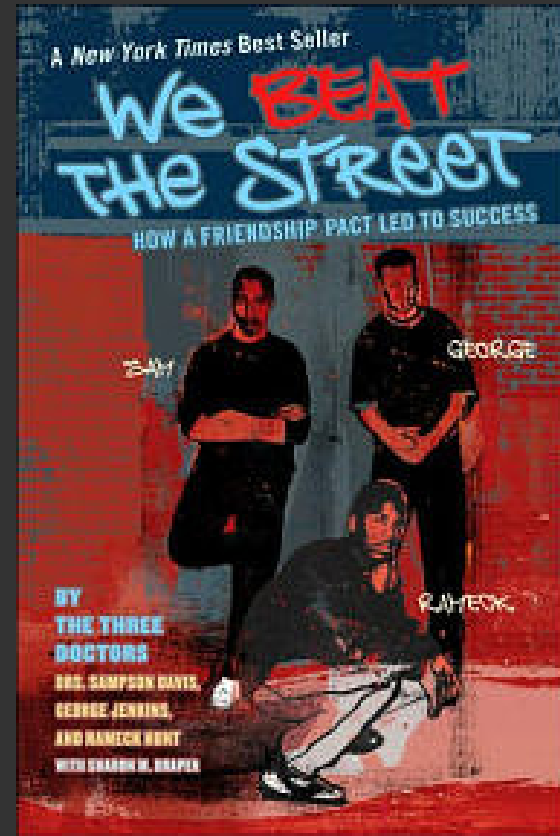


THE HONEST TRUTH BY DAN GEMEINHART

WE BEAT THE STREET BY THE THREE DOCTORS



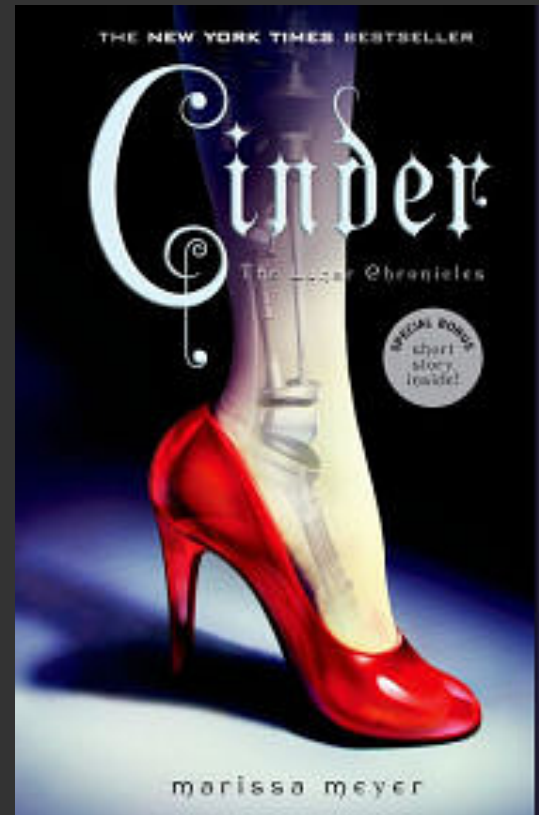

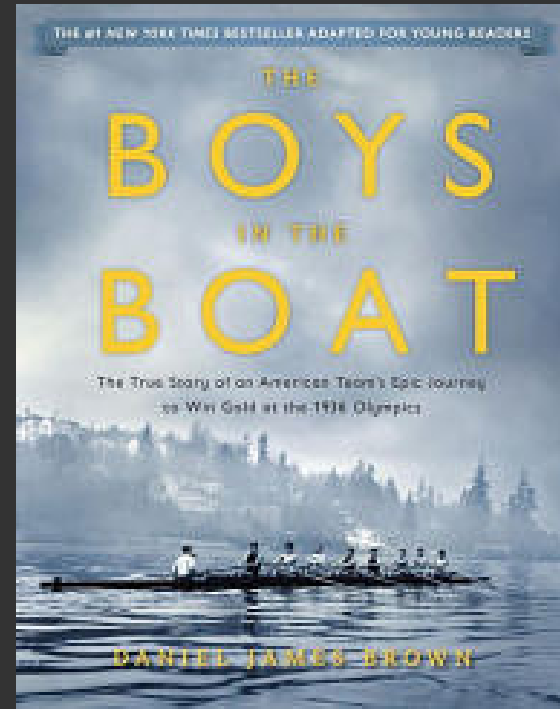

CINDER BY MARISSA MEYER



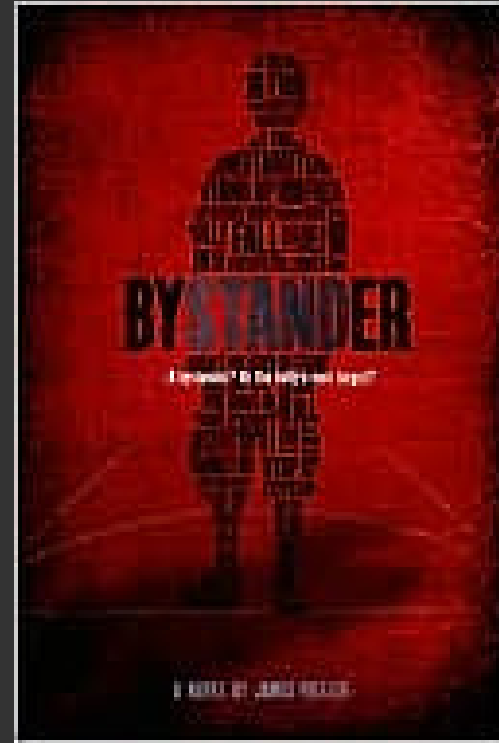

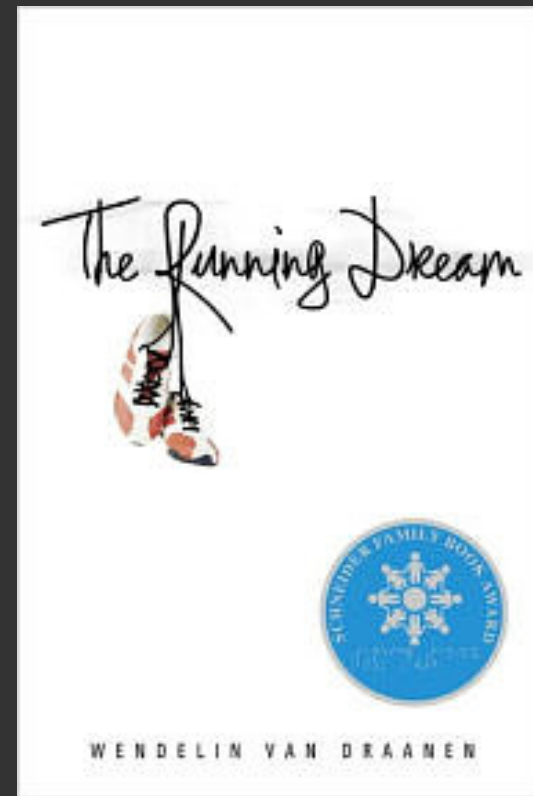
