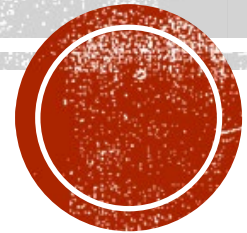

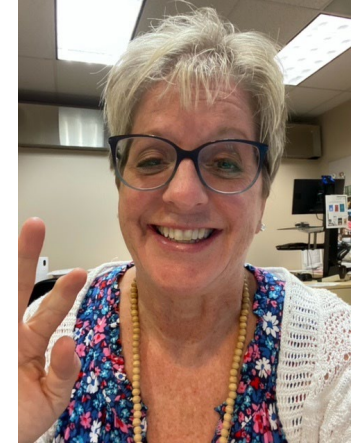

College/Career Guidance

- College information:

WHAT IS A CREDIT AND HOW DO THEY WORK?

Middle School

- Take a class
- Earn a grade
- Pass class = Move on to next level
- Fail class = Move on to next level

High School Credit EARNED in Middle School-

- Algebra 1, geometry, English 1, computer applications, WA state history, Spanish 1, etc.

High School

- Take a class
- Earn a grade
- Pass class (>60%) = .5 or 1.0 CREDIT
- Don't pass (<60%) = NO CREDIT

One high school year-long courses = 1 credit



CREDIT RECOVERY

- Credit Recovery Program
 - Many pathways to recover credit
 - Connect with our Success Coordinators, Ms. Britt, Ms. Bryan, Ms. Hernandez, Ms. Rey, and... your high school counselor
- Summer Program
 - Free for credit recover
 - Typically, in-person at Everett SD high school

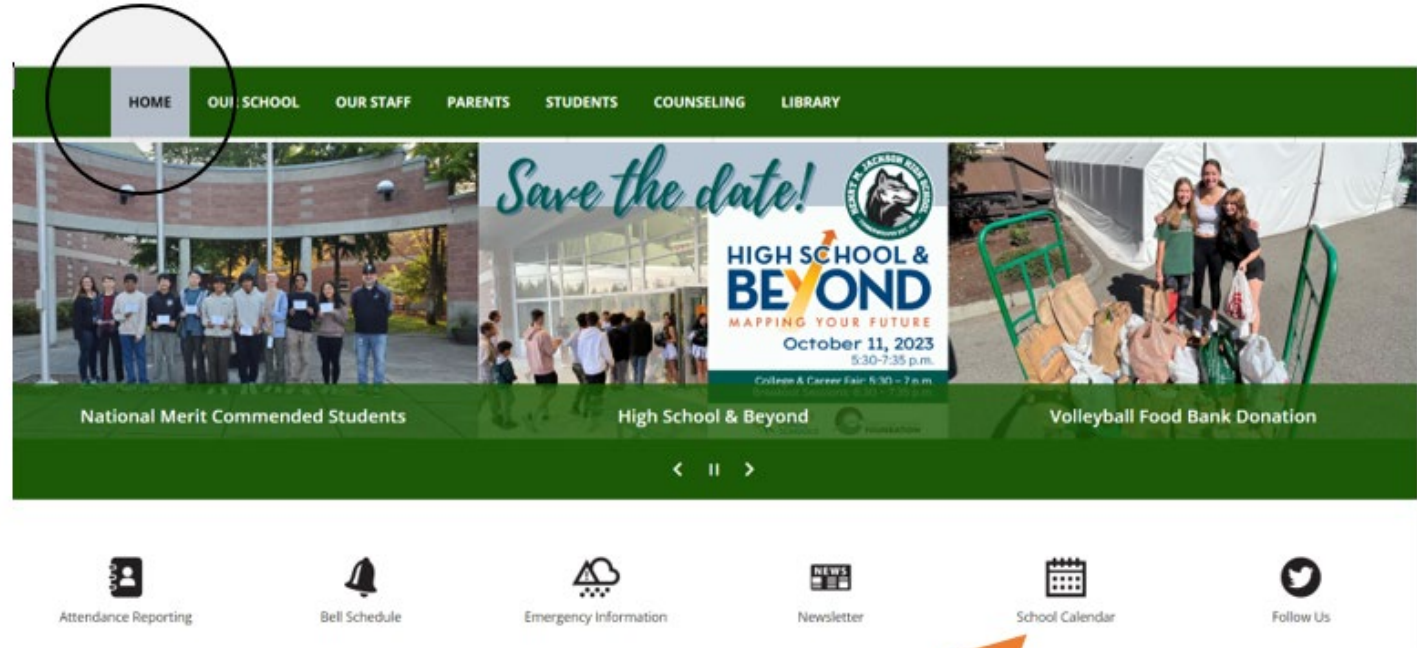

Go to school website, make sure you are on “home”, scroll down and look for the calendar icon.

HOW MANY CREDITS DO I NEED TO GRADUATE?

- You have to earn 24 credits to earn your high school diploma.
 - 9th grade- 6.0 credits (pass ALL classes)
 - 10th grade- 6.0 credits (pass ALL classes)
 - 11th grade- 6.0 credits (pass ALL classes)
 - 12th grade- 6.0 credits (pass ALL classes)
 - **TOTAL= 24 Credits**



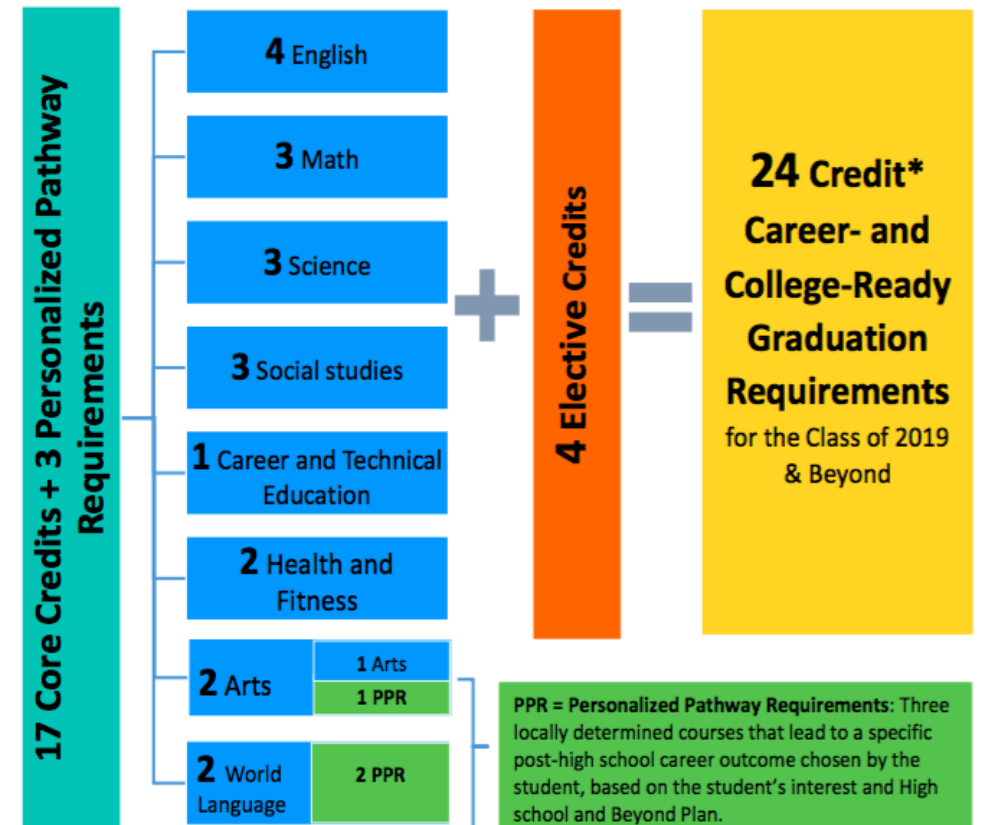

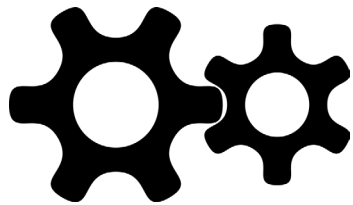

MORE GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & CTE PATHWAYS*

Primary Pathway:

- Smarter Balanced ELA (gd. 10)
- Smarter Balanced Math (gd. 10)
- Or... SAT ELA/Math
- Or... College level ELA/Math
- Or... complete 2.0 courses in a CTE pathway

Other tests: Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science-**WCAS** (gd. 11)



GRADUATION PATHWAYS

Planning for high school graduation starts in middle school. Students must meet one math and one English Language Arts (ELA) graduation pathway aligned with their high school and beyond plan to graduate from high school. The chart below describes options available.

HOW MANY VOLUNTEER HOURS ARE REQUIRED TO GRADUATE?

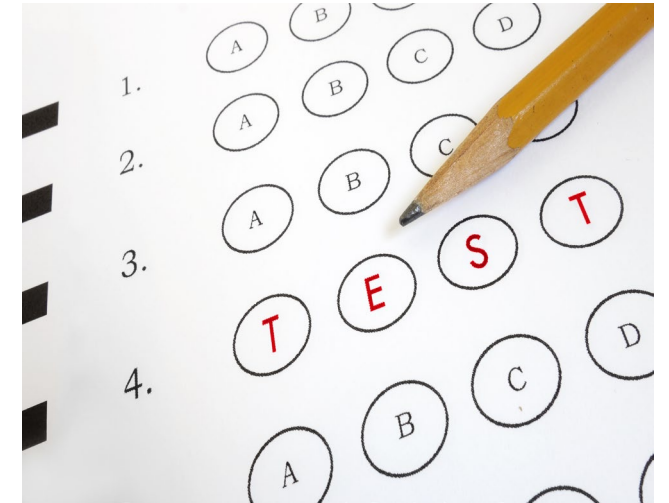


- It is fantastic for college applications and scholarships

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (SENIOR YEAR)

- **High School and Beyond Plan & additional graduation tasks (completed in Naviance)**
- **Senior Quantitative Class Requirement (Math or Science)**
- **College and Career Readiness Seminar**



PE COMPETENCY

PE Competency Credit (not PE Waiver)

- Must have completed PE 1
- Participate in a sport with coach/instructor
- Contact Mr. Hutt who handles paperwork for students requesting credit for sports they are playing. (more info. @ JHS counseling)
- Competency Credit must be earned during the current school year and season the PE activity is completed (IT IS NOT RETROACTIVE)

ALL STUDENT NEED .5 HEALTH & 1.5 PE CREDITS TO GRADUATE



HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT EARNED IN MIDDLE SCHOOL

ALL HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT EARNED IN MS IS BROUGHT UP TO YOUR HS TRANSCRIPT

Currently, there are three options for each HS class completed in Middle School...

1. Leave as is
2. Remove credit and grades from HS transcript
3. Remove grade, but leave credit on HS transcript (grade is marked "CR" for Credit)

-Please have your student contact their school counselor BY THE END OF THEIR JUNIOR YEAR to complete receive paperwork to complete Options 2 and 3 above.

You cannot remove courses & grades from your transcript that you earn during grades 9-12. Students can repeat a course and request GPA only be calculated for the course with the highest grade.

-Check school email daily (students and parents)

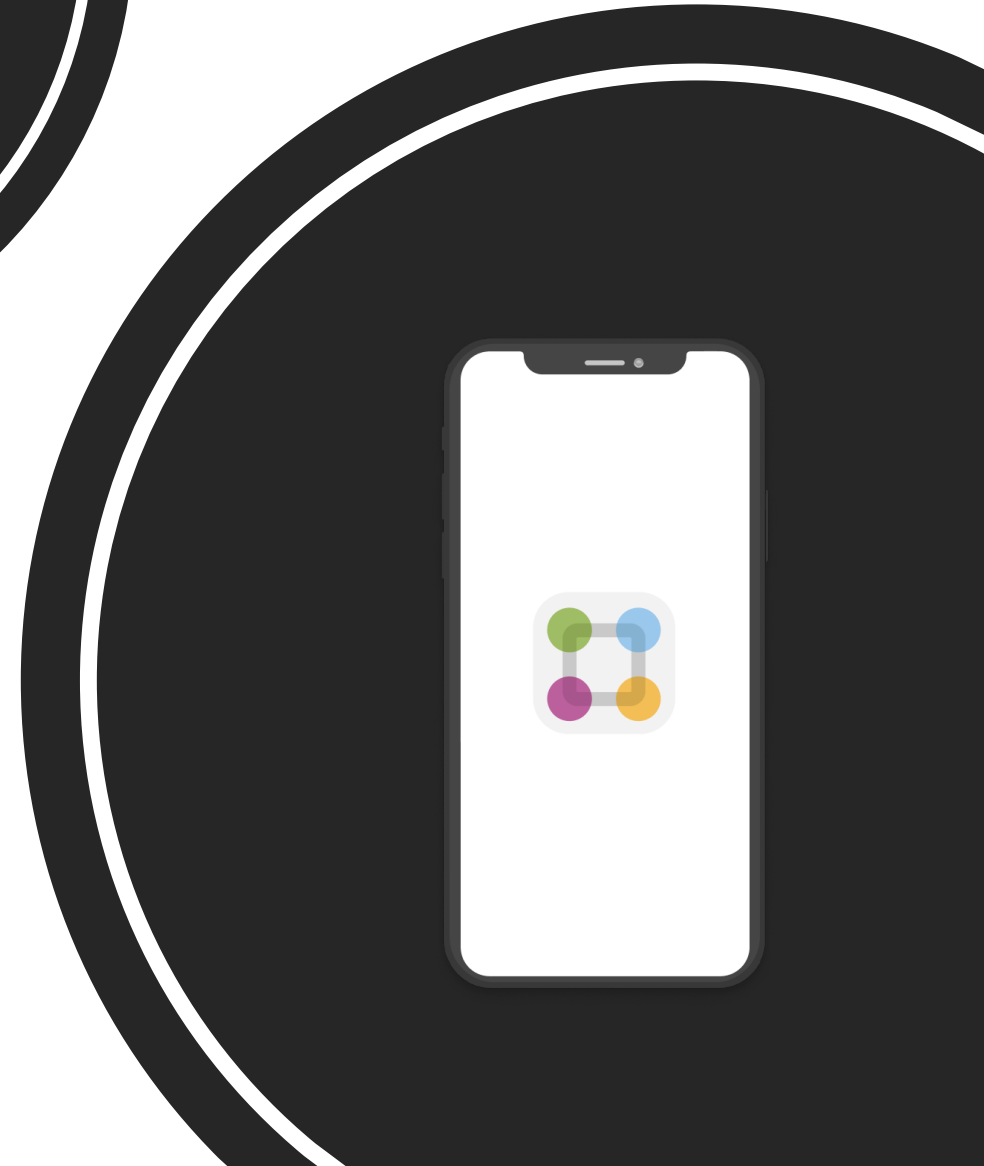
Have your students get the Outlook APP on their phone





TOOLS FOR SUCCESS!

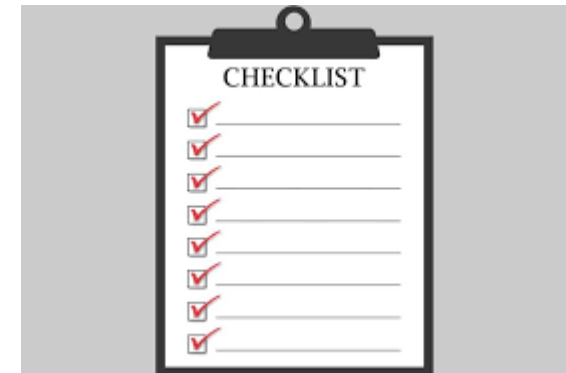
Parent Square and/or Email

Encourage your student to use an organizing tool to manage deadlines and tasks-

- Outlook
- Old-school planner
- Notes
- Try various apps out there



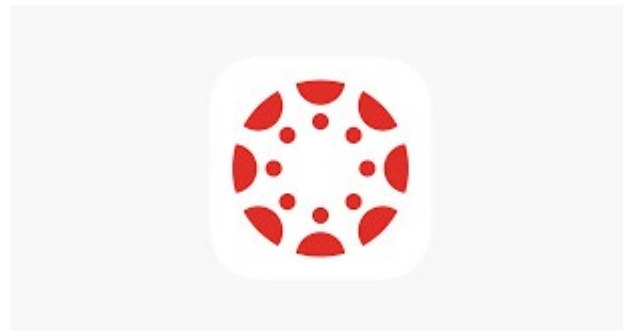
TOOLS FOR SUCCESS!

Set homework time every day (1 hour minimum)



TOOLS FOR SUCCESS!

Make a weekly time with your student(s) to check grades and Canvas (student led)



TOOLS FOR SUCCESS!

Manage phone use/social media

- Keep smartphones out of student bedrooms
- Use an alarm clock to wake students up





TOOLS FOR SUCCESS!

- -STUDENTS ARE THEIR OWN #1 ADVOCATE
- -Parents are advocate supporters
 - -Teach, remind, and encourage them
 - -Don't DO for them
 - -They will make mistakes
 - -They will be on their own soon enough



MORE TOOLS FOR SUCCESS!

- 1. Encourage good sleep habits, set bedtime, limit food/caffeine, etc.)**
- 2. Get involved (Clubs & Sports)**
- 3. Maintain expectations and provide support**
- 4. Give grace and practice patience (with yourself and your student)**
- 5. Utilize resources**
- 6. Consequences should be short-term**
- 7. Please join the PTSA!**



OVERCOMING CHALLENGES

- Talk with your student. Connect on their emotional level. Utilize tools like **RULER** if you need help (active listening, being aware of your emotions & managing them)
- Connect with your student's teachers
 - Ask what they are learning in class and how you could support at home.
- Create/review 4-year plan
- Encourage student to utilize:
 - PACK Time (every Thursday)
 - Teacher availability before/after school
- Connect with your school counselor/support coordinators
