These are classes that can be taken AT THE HIGH SCHOOL

They can get college credit AT THE HIGH SCHOOL

They can be rigorous and challenging for students AT THE HIGH SCHOOL

Students can extra help, potential corrections/redo's AT THE HIGH SCHOOL

Students stay with their friends, do not need a car, get extra help and are still involved with high school activities (sports, clubs, dances, school activities)

Running Start classes can interfere with friend groups, often need a car/bus, can

Momentum for College and Career



Rigorous coursework in high school prepares kids for college

"The academic intensity of the student's high school curriculum still counts more than anything else in precollegiate history in providing momentum toward completing a bachelor's degree" (Toolbox Revisited)

- Encourages engagement in school
- Earns credits towards College Graduation
- Students are more likely to complete a college degree is they complete 20 credits during the first year of enrollment

"It is all the more reason to begin the transition process in high school with expanded dual enrollment programs offering true postsecondary course work so that students enter higher education with a minimum of 5 additional credits to help them cross that 20-credit line. 6 is good; 9 is better and 12 is a guarantee or momentum – The Toolbox Revisited (2006)



\$aves Money

- Washington State College Graduates Class of 2022*
 - average debt upon graduation \$23,997
 - proportion with debt 47%

National Unemployment

- Unemployment rate 3.6%. (September 2023)
- Underemployment rate 6.4%. (2023)
- Had jobs not requiring college degree 44%
 But 75% of new job openings in 2022 requires a college degree, but 40% of people don't have it
- Strong economic returns for college degree
 - Unemployment rate of HS grads is 4.3% compared to 2.2% for college graduates



- Students earn college credit based on exam score



 College and University of Washington







END OF YEAR IN UW/EVCC/EDMONDS....

students will get a final grade from their JHS teacher This will go on the UW/EVCC/Edmonds transcript

From then on:

- Anything to do with that credit/class will be through the college system

*Please note: like AP Exams, students do not have to submit their UW/EVCC transcripts to their prospective colleges

First day to register for CHS classes: November 12, 2025

Last day to register for classes: January 16, 2026

*** Edmonds last registration date is January 8, 2026***

FOR FUTURE CLASSES....

UW CLASSES - 1 STEP

Students will get a registration number from their teacher email or on Canvas) Students register on-line; one step; 1 MONTH TIME PERIOD (mid-Sept.-Oct)

Teacher can "drop" students from UW class if they are not passing

EVCC/EDMONDS - 2 STEP

APPLY - starts mid-October: students will apply for a student number (ctcLink #) - takes 2+ weeks (application process open until January)

REGISTER - students will then register for their class (November-Jan): teachers will have their class name and number for students (Canvas?)

AP CLASS/TEST (May)

Students will pay for the test at school by end of October; can pay late (+\$40)
