HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE

Our Community

Spanning 39 square miles, Everett Public Schools serves the educational needs of over 20,000 students throughout 27 schools.

Rebounding from the 2020-21 school year, when all of the top 25 Washington state school districts saw decreased enrollment, Everett Public Schools was one of only 12 districts in the top 25 to see enrollment growth, continuing to rank 13th largest district in our state for the 2021-22 school year.

Our district's 27 schools include four high schools (grades 9-12), five middle schools (grades 6-8), and 18 elementary schools (grades K-5). Additionally, many students in our district are served by our Online High School, one of Washington State's oldest and most successful virtual learning programs, as well as our new (last year) K-8 Virtual Academy.

Our School

Henry M. Jackson High School (JHS) is a comprehensive four-year public school founded on the belief that all students can learn to a high standard.

Opened in 1994 in the rapidly growing community of Mill Creek, south of Everett, Jackson graduated its first senior class in 1997 and grew to nearly 2,300 students. Even with efforts to reduce school crowding in the ever-growing south end of our district, our current school enrollment is over 2,150 students.

Since its inception, students, staff, and parents have collaboratively developed the academic curriculum, guided by state and national laws.



Curriculum

Students at Henry M. Jackson High School typically earn 6.0 credits per year. The school year is divided into two semesters with six classes daily, each worth 0.5 credit. For the class of 2023, a total of 24 credits is required to receive a Henry M. Jackson High School diploma.

Online High School classes may be incorporated into the school day or, for a fee, may be taken to gain more than 6.0 credits during the school year.

We encourage all students to pursue challenging options to better prepare them for post-secondary education, training, and careers.

Students can access Advanced Placement classes at JHS in addition to college-level courses through Running Start, CTE Dual Credit, and College in the High School. JHS does not limit the number of AP classes that a student may take, and we encourage all students to pursue challenging options to better prepare them for success in post-secondary education, technical training, and careers.

The Sno-Isle TECH Skills Center, which serves 44 schools in the region, offers 20+ courses in five career pathways: business and marketing, human services, info tech, science and health, and trade and industry. Additionally, Everett Public Schools students have the option of earning credit for approved work experience.

"Since our school opened in 1994, it has been our mission to prepare students for success in college, career, and life," shared principal Lance Balla. "Although life for students has significantly changed in the last quarter-century, we continue to evolve our program to meet the needs of each student as we prepare them to be highly successful in jobs that currently exist, as well as those that may not yet exist using technologies that we cannot yet imagine. Ultimately, we want them to be prepared to meet the ever-changing challenges in our world today."

May 2021

We are proud to announce all Washington public baccalaureate institutions will be permanently SAT and ACT test optional beginning fall 2021.

We affirm that students will not be penalized during the admissions process nor will student eligibility for institutional supported scholarships, course placement or admissions to Honors programs be impacted due to the absence of a SAT or ACT standardized test score.

Together, we strongly support a holistic approach to admissions focused on the whole student and will not disadvantage any student without a test score. We hope that students will continue to seek challenges in high school, stay engaged in their schools and local communities, reach out to our institutions and explore the array of academic programs on our campuses.

The decision to move to permanent test optional policies reaffirm our sector's commitment to reduce barriers for students. Further, as we enter a period of post-COVID-19 recovery, we continue our commitment to learn from this historic challenge and embrace long-term changes that best serve our students and state.

Test Optional (SAT/ACT)

Continuation of testing policy:

Harvard's optional testing policy will remain in effect for all applicants through to the Harvard College Class of 2030. The past admissions cycle — for the Class of 2026 — was the second in which students were able to apply to Harvard without submitting standardized testing scores. Consistent with Harvard's whole-person admissions process, standardized tests are just one factor among many considered. Students who do not submit scores will not be disadvantaged in their application. test-optional policy.

I'm not a California resident. Am I required to submit SAT/ACT test scores?

No, UC will not consider ACT or SAT test scores for admissions decisions or the awarding of scholarships for any applicants. If you choose to submit test scores as part of your application, they may be used for course placement after you enroll.
