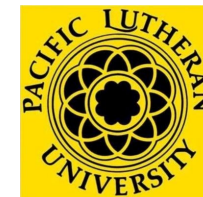

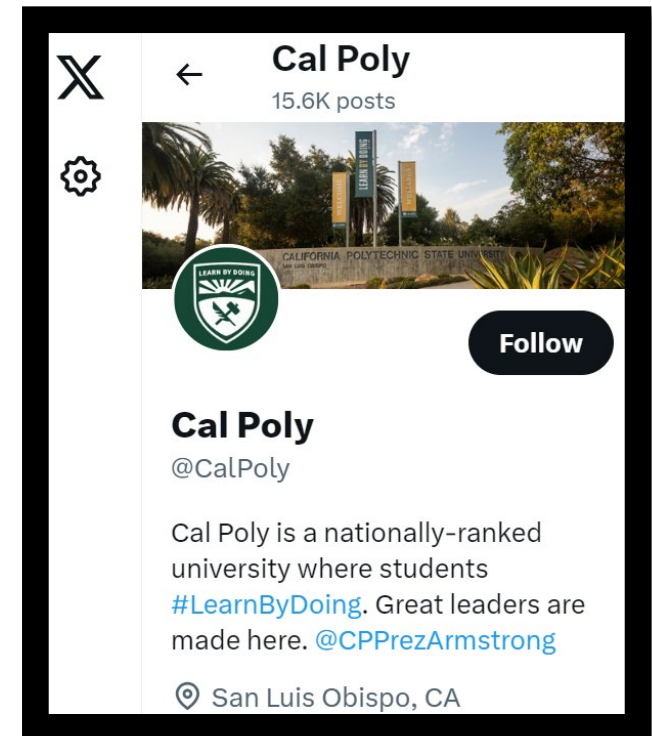
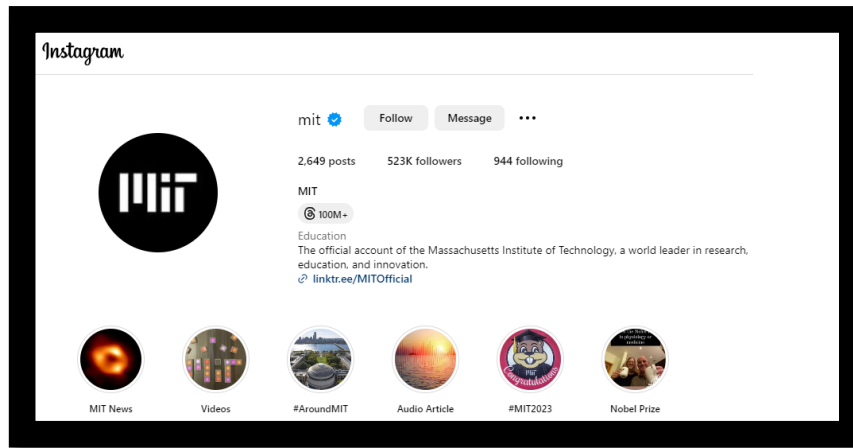

# Test Optional (SAT/ACT)



## Standardized tests (not required)

UC eliminated its standardized test requirement in 2020.

UC no longer considers SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships. Test scores submitted as part of the application may be used as an alternate method of fulfilling minimum requirements for eligibility or for course placement after matriculation at UC.

**NYU will continue to remain test-optional for the 2024-2025 application cycle.** For students who elect to submit testing as part of their application, NYU has one of the most flexible testing policies of any college or university.

Columbia is test-optional for applicants to Columbia College or Columbia Engineering.

**Duke University will be test-optional** for both first-year and transfer applicants in the 2024-25 admissions cycle.

Students who apply without SAT or ACT scores this year will **not be at a disadvantage** in our consideration of their applications. Our **decisions are based on a student's comprehensive application materials**, with or without test scores.

Notre Dame is test-optional for the 2024 and 2025 application cycles, meaning students may choose whether or not to submit their test scores with their applications. See [test-optional questions](#) below for further details.

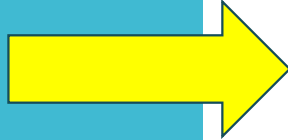



### HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE

#### Our Community

Spanning 39 square miles, Everett Public Schools serves the educational needs of over 20,000 students throughout 27 schools.

Rebounding from the 2020-21 school year, when all the top 25 Washington state school districts saw decreased enrollment, Everett Public Schools was one of only 12 districts in the top 25 to see enrollment growth in 2021-22, subsequently rising to rank 13th largest district in our state for the 2023-24 school year.

Our district's 27 schools include four high schools (grades 9-12), five middle schools (grades 6-8), and 18 elementary schools (grades K-5). Additionally, students in our district are served by various alternative learning options including our online program, which is one of Washington State's oldest and most successful virtual learning programs.

#### Our School

Henry M. Jackson High School (JHS) is a comprehensive four-year public school founded on the belief that all students can learn to a high standard.

Opened in 1994 in the rapidly growing community of Mill Creek, south of Everett, Jackson graduated its first senior class in 1997 and has grown to over 2,100 students. Jackson is currently rated as one of the best schools in the state, thanks to its robust course options and its student success on standardized testing, including state assessments and AP tests.

Since its inception, students, staff, and parents have worked collaboratively to develop and maintain an academic curriculum that supports and challenges all students.



#### Curriculum

Students at Henry M. Jackson High School typically earn 6.0 credits per year. The school year is divided into two semesters with six classes daily, each worth 0.5 credit. For the class of 2025, a total of 24 credits is required to receive a Henry M. Jackson High School diploma.

Online classes may be incorporated into the school day or, for a fee, may be taken to gain more than 6.0 credits during the school year.

*We encourage all students to pursue challenging options to better prepare them for post-secondary education, technical training, and careers.*

Students can access Advanced Placement classes at JHS in addition to college-level courses through Running Start, CTE Dual Credit, and College in the High School. JHS does not limit the number of AP classes that a student may take, and we encourage all students to pursue challenging options to better prepare them for success in post-secondary education, technical training, and careers.

The Sno-Isle TECH Skills Center, which serves 44 schools in the region, offers 20+ courses in five career pathways: business and marketing, human services, info tech, science and health, and trade and industry. Our students also have access to STEM programs at our other high schools as well as the Regional Apprenticeship Pathways program in neighboring Marysville School District. Additionally, Everett Public Schools students have the option of earning credit for approved work experience.

Since our school opened in 1994, it has been our mission to prepare students for success in college, career, and life. Although life for students has significantly changed in the last quarter-century, we continue to evolve our program to meet the needs of each student as we prepare them to be highly successful in jobs that currently exist, as well as those that may not yet exist using technologies that we cannot yet imagine. Ultimately, we want them to be prepared to meet the ever-changing challenges in our world today.

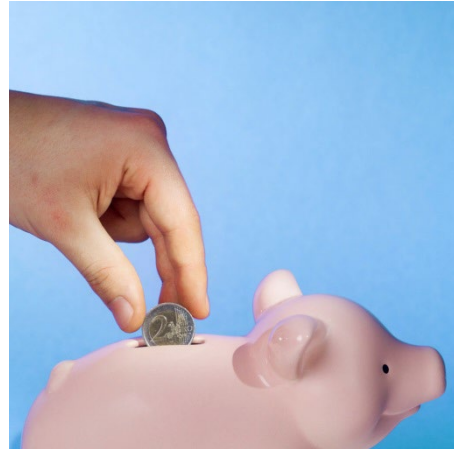

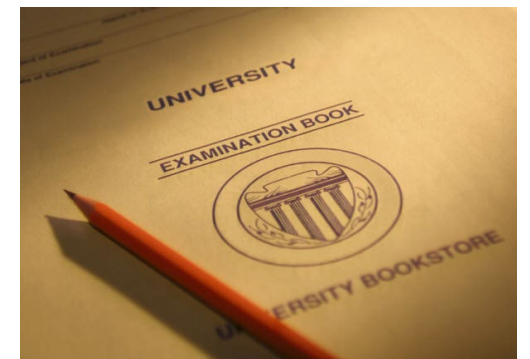
