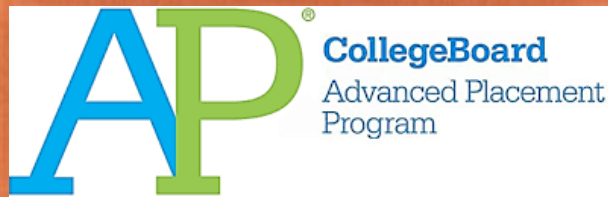

ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY



- All Students will have their own district-supplied computer
- * **Calls or txt's should *not* be made by parents or family members to student cell phones during class times.**

New cell phone policy

The use of cell phones in the classroom can distract students from instruction, yet can be important to have accessible in case of emergency. With this in mind, the district has adopted a new [policy 3246](#) and [procedure 3246P](#) which prohibits cell phone use in the classroom while still providing access for students in case of emergency.

High school students who choose to bring cell phones and other personal electronic devices to school may only use them during transition periods, at lunch, and before/after the school day. Students are expected to silence their cell phones before entering a classroom.

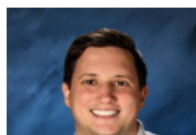

REPORTING AN ABSENCE

LIMITED OPEN CAMPUS

Open Campus is a privilege available to Juniors and Seniors meeting the following requirements:

- No more than 3 days on which an unexcused absence is recorded from the previous semester.
- No in- or out-of-school suspensions in the previous semester
- Parent permission required

*Limited open-campus lunch **can be revoked** if a student violates the above mentioned requirements.*



PAY TO PLAY - ATHLETIC FEES

High school fees are \$100/season

- Students need an ASB card to participate
- The fee offsets the costs of coaching, transportation, etc.
- Fees should be paid after teams are selected & before the first contest.
- Families needing financial assistance may contact the building athletic coordinator to request payment plans or fee reductions based on financial need.

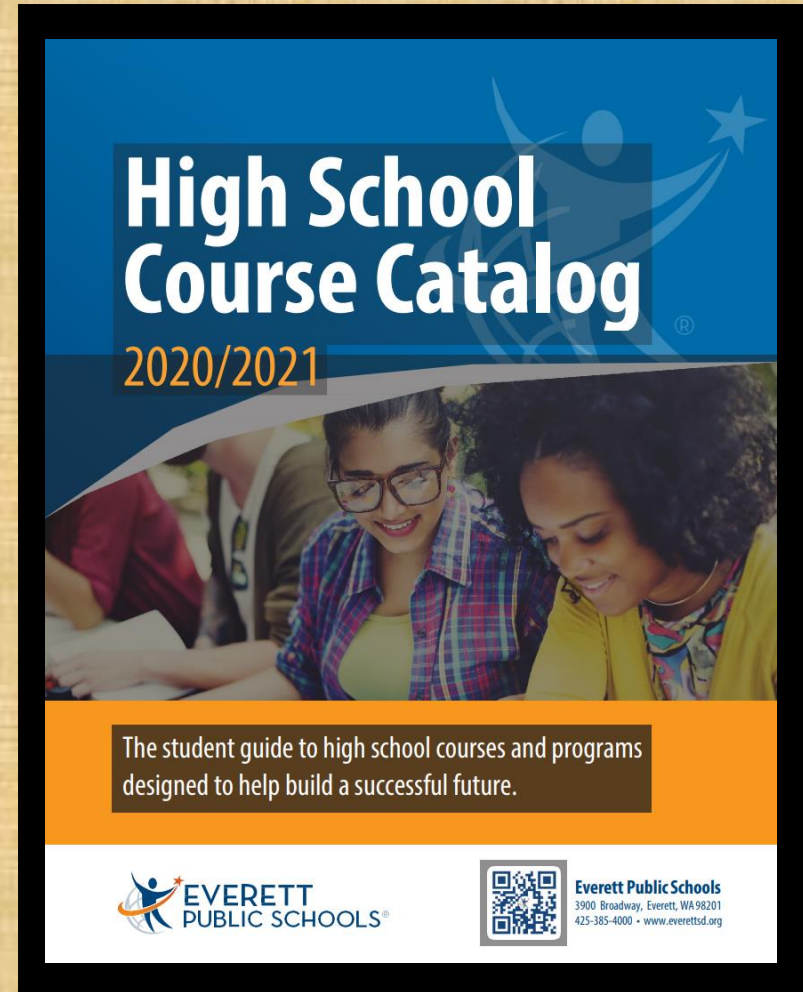
