From Becky Hassler, Math Coach

Here are some things you can do with your child during Summer Vacation (or anytime you like) to give them some math practice and to keep them from losing skills while they are not in school. The trick is to highlight the math in everyday activities:

- When shopping kids can calculate change, figure out a discount, or weigh fruits and veggies on the scale in the produce section. They can figure out what it will cost to buy two or three of an item.
- When cooking kids can measure ingredients or figure out how to half or double a recipe. They can figure out the fraction of a whole item that each serving represents (1/2 of a sandwich or 1/8 of a pizza).
- Make a schedule for the day and have students figure out how much time they will spend doing different activities on the schedule. Ask your child frequently to read the time, and have analog clocks in the house, not just digital clocks.
- When traveling kids can help to plan a budget (what is the total price of 4 museum tickets if each one costs 8 dollars?), or figure out the distance left to travel and the amount of time that might take.
- Play board games or card games, and do puzzles. Many games involve a lot of math calculations or spatial reasoning.

You can also help your child by challenging them to memorize their math facts. Kindergarten students should work on addition facts to 10. First and second graders should work on addition and subtraction facts to 20. Third, fourth, and fifth graders should master multiplication and division facts to twelves.

Stuff the Bus is coming!

Vaccinations for next year

Now is the time to plan for the vaccinations your child will need before he or she enrolls next fall. Students over the age of 11 entering 6th grade require one booster dose of Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccine before the first day of the 6th grade. Students entering high school require two varicella vaccines before the first day of high school. We encourage you to obtain these vaccinations this school year and report them to the school nurse or office staff at your child's school. We'll track that information in the school database, which will help you avoid getting calls and overdue letters in the fall.

SBA scores are coming soon
