Remember that research has shown that literacy growth is largely dependent on the amount of reading a child does, so please continue to support your child by encouraging them to read every day at home. Your efforts will help to ensure that your child becomes a stronger reader and a strong learner.

If your child brings them to school, his/her teacher will take them and a parent or guardian will have to come to school to retrieve them. Please help us with this and speak with your student about appropriate places to play with cards.

#### Tips for Families to Support School Attendance

At Hawthorne Elementary, we continue to positively influence student attendance. To do so, this school year we are promoting school attendance during morning announcements, encouraging students to arrive on time with our "No Tardy Taters" challenge, building a positive school climate through (PBIS) Positive Behavioral Intervention Supports, using positive motivation charts for students who struggle to arrive on time, making home visits and supporting students and families to address barriers that influence attendance. We have included some tips for families to support school attendance in order to maximize students' educational achievement.

- Help your child understand that school is your child's job
  - Make school a priority and your expectation for your child
  - o Talk to your child about the importance of daily attendance and how it helps his/her learning
- Help your child build good habits like:
  - Finishing homework and placing it in his/her backpack
  - o Laying out clothes and their backpack in the evening before bed
  - o Turning off electronic devices at least 1 hour before bedtime and then reading until lights off
  - Having a regular bedtime for a good night's sleep
  - Leaving early enough in the morning to get to school on time
- When your child is sick
  - Only let your child stay home if he/she is truly sick. Sometimes complaints of a headache or stomachache might be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home. Contact the teacher or school counselor for support if you think this might be happening
- Appointments and vacations
  - Make every effort to schedule doctor, dentist, and other appointments after school hours
  - o If your child must be out of school for an appointment, get him/her back to school for at least part of the school day
  - Plan vacations when school is not in session

Thank you for your ongoing support at Hawthorne and enjoy the rest of our winter season!

If you're logged into the district's mobile app, you can find and pay your student's lunch balance under your student's info. An icon inside the app also gives a shortcut to deposit funds for your student's lunch account. To make a payment, look for the green chef's hat icon.

available in the online iTunes® and Google Play® app stores. Once you've downloaded the app, log in to "student info" with your LMS password to see student-specific information for each of your children.
