More Information Regarding Coronaviruses

We have received questions from a few parents asking for our school's policy regarding the coronaviruses. Jackson will follow our district's policy. Our district sent communication to families regarding Coronaviruses a few weeks ago. Our district is following the direction of the Snohomish Health District and will keep you appraised as we receive information to be shared. Here are a few reminders regarding the Coronavirus that were shared in the district communication.

Coronaviruses are primarily spread through respiratory droplets, which means to become infected, people generally have to be within six feet of someone who is contagious for an extended period of time and have droplets land on them. This is very different from airborne diseases like measles, so the public health response is different.

The best way to reduce the risk of getting this or any viral respiratory infection includes:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands
- · Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces

Summer School at Lowell Elementary

From June 29-July 23, Monday-Thursday from 9:15-1:15, students will be transported to Lowell elementary to have the opportunity to practice skills they have learned this year and prepare for the coming school year. Teachers will provide your child with instruction in reading, writing, math, and science. The daily schedule includes 60 minutes of science, 60 minutes of reading and writing in small groups, 60 minutes of math, and 15 minutes of Second Step social skills. Students will participate in a variety of engaging and fun activities that will build their vocabulary and improve their skills. Math content will focus on number sense, place value, and operations and algebraic thinking. Students will have access to the school library for weekly book checkout to encourage participation in the Summer Reading Challenge. The class will have approximately 15 students with one teacher and para-educator support. Your child will receive 70 hours of small group, focused instruction in key skills for success in the coming year. Your child will have fun learning and exploring!

Summer school is by invitation or request by parent. You should receive enrollment paperwork by next week. You child's teacher will share additiona; information with you during conferences, please be sure to return their enrollment forms to the office as soon as complete. If you have questions, please contact Mrs. Reyes.

Smarter Balanced Assessment Schedule (SBA)

Grades 3-5 students will begin the Smarter Balanced Assessment required by the State when they come back from spring break, **April 21 through May 21st.** These tests are delivered on Chromebooks in the areas required (3rd—Math and ELA, 4th –Math and ELA, and 5th – Math, ELA, and Science). If you have any questions about this test or if you feel like your child may need some addaitonal supports, please inquire with your child's teacher at your conference at the end of the motnth. Many of these tests require the use of headphones, which may be provided by the school or be personal headsets, if you or your child prefers. If students require more time to test than the time allocated in our testing schedule with their regular teacher/proctor, they will be able to test as long as needed in small groups with other trained proctors until our state testing window closes on June 5. Plesae plan appointemnts and family travel accordingly. Your support in making sure your kiddo is at school on time and well rested will be helpful in starting out their test successfully. Remember to register to vote

By registering to vote, either in person or online, you are able to exercise a basic democratic right.

1. In person -- You may register to vote or change your registration at Snohomish County Elections, 3000 Rockefeller Ave, Everett, 1st Floor, Admin Bldg West.

2. Online -- If you have a valid Washington state driver's license, you may register with the <u>Secretary of State</u> quickly and easily online. You may also download a voter registration form in several languages from that site.

3. Online – Visit the district's bond 2020 page at <u>www.everettsd.org/bond2020</u> and click on "register to vote" on the left hand side. To learn details about elections, visit the <u>Snohomish County Elections</u> website.
