# **From the Principal**

#### The Halfway Point of the Year

It is hard to believe that the school year is already half over! The start of the second semester is upon us which gives us the opportunity to re-visit some points that we addressed in the fall, get our new families on board, and look ahead to the second half of the school year. First and foremost, I want to emphasize the importance of consistent school attendance. It is critical that your child is here each day on time and ready to learn. Yes, it is the cold and flu season, so thank you for not bringing your child to school if they have/had a fever or have vomited in the last 24 hours. Please let us know if you need assistance in this area by calling the school office at (425) 385-6900.

#### Arrival Time in the Mornings

For those who eat breakfast at school, our cafeteria opens at **8:55 a.m.**, so no students should be dropped off or arrive on campus before that time. We can ensure their safety when we have supervision in place and that begins at 8:55 a.m. daily. The late bell rings at **9:15 a.m.**, the official start to the student day. Important activities happen right when that bell rings, so please be sure your child is here to get a great start to their school day.

Parents/Guardians often ask, **"How can we help at home?"** Our teachers have been sharing strategies through fall parent conferences, classroom newsletters, SeaSaw Class, and calls/e-mails home. Here are a few ways that you can make an impact on your child's school success:

 Communication: each day, check your child's backpack, review their planner and any paperwork from the teacher, and talk with your child about their day. We care about our children's academic progress but also about their social/emotional needs. Taking a few minutes to chat with your child about their day can shed light on areas of need that you can share with us.

- Homework: practicing the skills students have learned at school will strengthen them, whether that is reading each day, practicing multiplication facts, completing the homework that teachers assign, or doing the assigned i-Ready lessons. Make this a priority and consider stopping to assist your child or model daily reading yourself during family "homework time."
- **Volunteer at school**: this can be during the student day as a classroom volunteer or Watch D.O.G., or it can be after hours at one of our many school family events. Our students love having volunteers working with them.
- Safely transporting students: I have seen an increase of parent vehicle traffic on 129<sup>th</sup> and in the staff only parking lot. As a reminder, the student drop-off and pick-up should only occur in the front parking lot. Saving time should not be a reason to impact safety. Due to the safety of the busses, we ask parents to not to use the staff only parking lot in the back. Additionally, we have a high number of students walking to and from school on 129<sup>th</sup>. Please be careful and follow the posted traffic speed to protect our students. Also, let's be respectful to our neighbors and avoided parking in their private lots. We are all in this together.

As always, the partnership between school and home is a vital one. Thank you for continuing to stay involved in your child's education, at whatever level your schedule allows. Go Mustangs!



#### Mustang Miles Continues to Grow

Over **636 miles** strong, is the distance to date, by a group of Silver Lake students who arrive at the gym before school. It happens every **Friday morning from 8:35 to 8:55 AM**. During this optional before school club students walk or jog laps on our track or undercover area, or in the gym – depending on the weather; many doing a mile per session. Signed permission slips are required before participating; these are available in the school office. Enrollment is open through April, the program continues until June. This is a fitness club or activity, with students earning a small token after completing miles (walking or jogging 5 miles = one token). # From the Health Room

#### Because we care about protecting students and their families from contagious diseases . . .



- Please keep an ill student home, or make arrangements with a caregiver, when signs or symptoms of illness are present.
- Students with symptoms of illness at school may place other students at risk of illness, and will need to be picked up promptly.
- Please notify us if your student has a contagious illness. An exposure may be lifethreatening for others with fragile immune systems or certain medical conditions.
- Your student's health information will be treated confidentially.

**Fever** – Temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher. Student needs to be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school. Giving a fever reducing medication just before returning to school does not make a student well. It may only mask the fever until the medication wears off. In this situation, a student needs to be home so others are not exposed to illness.

# **Everett School Board Welcomes Two New Members**

This November voters elected two new members to the Everett School District Board. April Berg will fill position 2, the seat vacated by the retirement of longtime school board director Carol Andrews. Berg lives in Mill Creek and is a planning commissioner for the city. She has four children, two in university, one at Henry M. Jackson High School and one at Heatherwood Middle School





Andrew J. Nicholls will fill position 1, the seat held by Jamyang Dorjee Nhangkar who was appointed to the board in September 2018. Nicholls is a research social worker with the VA Puget Sound Medical Center and has two children who will soon be entering school in the district's north end.

If you're logged into the district's mobile app, you can find and pay your student's lunch balance under your student's info. An icon inside the app also gives a shortcut to deposit funds for your student's lunch account. To make a payment, look for the green chef's hat icon.

available in the online iTunes® and Google Play® app stores. Once you've downloaded the app, log in to "student info" with your LMS password to see student-specific information for each of your children.
