## From the Principal

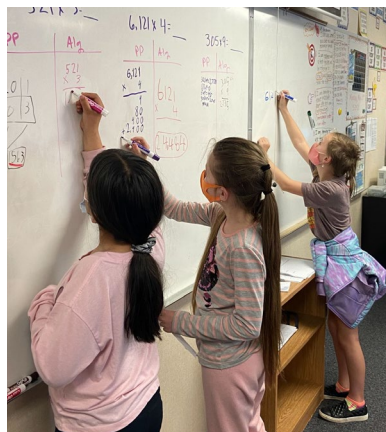
Silver Lake Families,

Everett Public Schools policy regarding vacations or travel can be found on page 5 of 9 in **Procedure 3122P Attendance:**

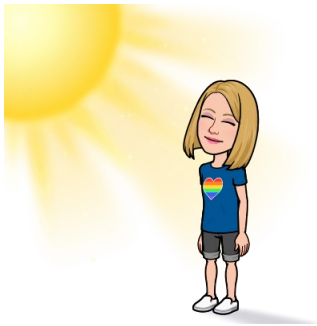
*Families should not schedule vacations or travel while school is in session. If a family vacation or travel must occur while school is in session, it must be prearranged prior to the absence and approved by the principal or designee pursuant to item 12 above. The principal or designee may excuse up to five (5) school days for a prearranged absence per student each school year. Assignments requested for a prearranged absence will be provided to the student or parent/guardian if requested five (5) school days prior to the absence.*

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## From the Counselor



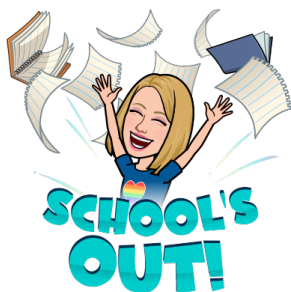
I can't believe that the summer is 4 weeks away. What an experience we've all been through this past year! As challenging as it has been, I always try to focus on the ways that the challenge has made me better. What I (think 😊) I learned is that anything can change at any moment and the more flexible I can be, the better off I am. I've always tried to keep an open mind to new experiences, but this past year has forced me into uncomfortable situations where I found myself wanting to retreat and stay quiet. I have pushed myself to get comfortable being uncomfortable and roll with change. Not only has it helped me stay positive—it has also helped me grow as a person.

Now, we are looking at a transition back to in-building learning next fall. What a major change for all of us! It is going to be critical that we spend the summer preparing ourselves and our students for this change back to the classroom. How can we best prepare our kids? Here are some ideas:



- **Talk, Talk, Talk**
  - o Continue an open-conversation with your kids all summer about their feelings about going back to school. Are they worried? Excited? Nervous? They may have different thoughts and feelings every week! While validating their feelings is very important, you can also help them reframe their negative thoughts to positive thoughts. For example, if your child is worried about getting sick, let them know that you understand their fear, but ask them what they can do to stay healthy in school. Wear a mask? Wash their hands? Practice social distancing? Changing their worries to positive thoughts will lessen the anxiety they are feeling about returning to school.
- **Model Good Coping Behaviors**
  - o We parents have also lived through this pandemic and are feeling nervous about a return to school, but remember that how we handle our emotions can have an impact on how our children handle their emotions. Be open about your feelings, but also be open with your children about your coping strategies. They will learn from you!
- **Turn off the News**
  - o The news can be scary, especially for children. They often confuse facts with fantasy. Try not to have the news on when your small children are in the room.
  - o If the kids hear a news story that is upsetting, let them ask questions. Many times kids get their information from social media or friends and this will give you an opportunity to correct the facts.
- **Get Outside**
  - o As the community continues to open back up, give your kids more experiences outside the home, as you feel safe. The more they can interact with others and see the return to “normal,” the more they will begin to be comfortable with the idea of being around others.
- **Develop a Daily Routine**
  - o To be successful in the fall, kids need to be on a good sleep schedule. Work over the summer on a set sleep time at night and wake up time in the morning. Have meals at the same times every day. The more their bodies are adjusted to the school schedule by September, the easier the drop off for school will be!
  - o Kids may have developed a strong routine of “screen time” during the pandemic. Try to limit the amount of time they are on screens and get them outside, in the sun, and with others. This will increase their endurance for school come September.

This is a big transition and as exciting as it may be for us, there’s a lot to prepare for. Thank goodness for summer! As always, if you have any questions or want to chat, don’t hesitate to reach out, and have a WONDERFUL summer!

Thank you so much, **Silver Lake Families!** Because of you, we were able to raise about **\$3,500** in new books for the library. This funding is very important as it is the main way we get new materials in the library and to help replace lost or damaged books.

The last day for remote library checkout is Wednesday, June 2. The last day for hybrid checkout is either Tuesday, June 1 or Friday, June 4 depending on if your student is in Hybrid A or Hybrid B. **All library books are due Friday, June 11.** There are currently over 1,000 books lost in our library system! Overdue and Lost notices will be emailed each Friday afternoon. Please help your student look for and return their books at your earliest convenience. You can return the books to the front office Monday - Friday from 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Student Elementary Progress Reports (report cards) will be held in the office until either fines are paid or books are returned/replaced. ## District Updates

### What will the 2021-22 school year look like?

Everett Public Schools, like other districts in our region, state and nationally, are planning on opening 100% in person in the fall. The anticipation is great as students may be entering a school for the first time or may not have seen their classmates in person for over a year. We look forward to the energy as the new year kicks off.



All staff will be back in the buildings. Students will be learning in-person. We know that nothing is 100% guaranteed in the future, but we are moving forward with this plan and encourage you to anticipate learning in person in the fall. We are looking into virtual opportunities for students and will share more about that in the future.

### When does school end this year?

**The last day of school this year is Monday, June 21st, and will be an asynchronous day.** The day will be used for device and material drop off and pick up. We will be sending more information soon. June 15 is the last day of synchronous learning for seniors.

### Care Solace resource



Everett Public Schools fosters a culture that promotes the health, safety and well-being of students, parents and staff. In an effort to continuously support this commitment, the district has partnered with **Care Solace**.



Care Solace is an [online resource](#) with a live 24/7 concierge meant to assist individuals in finding local mental health-related programs and counseling services. Care Solace is a tool for school staff and families to connect with community-based mental healthcare resources and providers. Their proprietary care navigation system taps into a vast database of mental healthcare resources to find carefully vetted local therapists and programs in minutes. Care Solace is available for use by district families and staff at no cost.

## Kindergarten Enrollment (Class of 2034)

## Jump Start program



**Jump Start** is a one-week transition program for *current* kindergarten and first-grade students. It will be offered August 16-20, in the morning, at all available elementary schools. Incoming first and second graders are invited to participate in this program designed to support them as they transition back to the in-person learning model, become familiar with school routines and the campus, meet teachers and school staff, and get to know their classmates before school starts in

September. If your student will be in first or second grade in September, register by June 14 for Jump Start by completing the 'Jump Start - 1st Grade or 2nd Grade' [Registration Form](#).



## Vaccinations for next year

Now is the time to plan for the vaccinations your child may need before they return next fall. We encourage you to obtain these vaccinations as soon as possible and provide documentation to your child's school health room staff. Providing this information before the new school year will help you avoid getting calls and letters as well as the potential exclusion from school in the fall. As a reminder, students entering 7th grade usually require a Tdap booster before they can start school. More information can be found on the district's [immunizations webpage](#).

## What Every Parent Needs to Know video series



The Everett PTSA Council collaborated with Everett Public Schools staff and Washington Family Engagement to develop video resources for families which provide fundamental information to navigate school systems, advocate for their student(s), and actively participate in public education.

The project of five videos, entitled "What Every Parent Needs to Know," provides an overview of topics that parents felt were essential for building a foundation for authentic parent and family engagement. Video topics include: Student Education Rights, Get Engaged in Your Children's Education, What to Do About Bullying, Advocating for Your Student and Understanding Public Schools.

The initial material was created by Washington Family Engagement and further reviewed by parent and community groups, as well as Everett School District staff, to ensure accuracy, relevancy, and access. The videos were recorded by various district staff and are available on the district's Parent University webpage, with translations recorded and available in Spanish, and subtitles in Russian, Vietnamese, and Arabic.

## Programa de “Jump Start”



**Jump Start** es un programa de transición de una semana dirigido a los alumnos *que cursan actualmente* el kínder y el primer grado. Será ofrecido del 16 al 20 de agosto por las mañanas en todas las escuelas primarias disponibles. Los alumnos ingresando al primero y segundo grado están invitados a participar en este programa diseñado para brindarles apoyo en su transición de vuelta al modelo de aprendizaje en persona, para que se familiaricen con las rutinas de la escuela, con el plantel escolar, conozcan a sus maestros y al personal, y

conozcan a sus compañeros antes de iniciar clases en septiembre. Si su estudiante va entrar a primero o segundo grado en septiembre, regístrelo antes del 14 de junio a Jump Start llenando [el formulario de registro de Jump Start para 1ro y 2do grado](#).

## Vacunas para el próximo año escolar

Ahora es buen momento para planear las vacunas que su hijo/a puedan necesitar antes de regresar el próximo otoño. Lo exhortamos a que obtenga las vacunas lo más pronto posible y proporcione documentación al personal del aula de salud de la escuela de su hijo/a. Al proporcionar esta información antes del nuevo año escolar ayudará a evitar recibir llamadas y cartas y una posible exclusión de la escuela en otoño. Como recordatorio, los alumnos ingresando al 7mo grado usualmente requieren el refuerzo Tdap antes de iniciar la escuela. 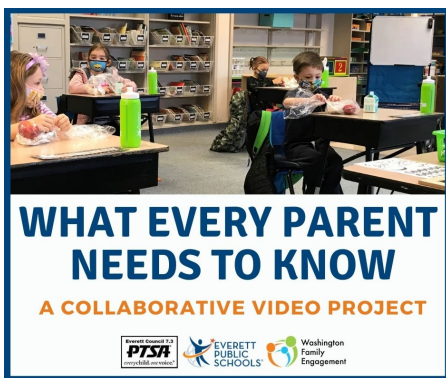


# Aprendizaje socioemocional (SEL) para los alumnos de primaria
