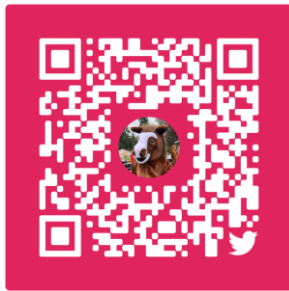
growing membership means more of our community is heard and represented. For more information, you can find links through our website under the Parents tab.

Curbside Check Out at Silver Lake

Hello families! Silver Lake started Curbside Check Out on Friday, October 9th for 4th and 5th Grade. 2nd and 3rd grade started on Tuesday, October 20th. Kindergarten and 1st Grade started on Tuesday, November 3rd. Below is the process for putting books on hold and checking them out at Silver Lake Elementary.



1. Students can **place holds** through [Destiny Discover](#) on two books that are “in” as well as books that are “out”. If students are not sure how to place holds on books, please see [this video](#); email Mrs. Sand if you have further questions! If a student places a hold on a book that is “in”, I will pull that book off the shelf and label it for the student. *Please be careful because once you hold a book, you cannot unhold a book.* Contact Mrs. Sand if you need to take a book off of a hold.
2. You can **pick up** books **Tuesdays** from 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM and **Fridays** from 2:00 PM to 3:00 PM in the Silver Lake [back parking lot](#).
3. Every Tuesday and Friday, **I will email Holds Ready notices so you will know if the hold is ready.** *Holds placed after noon on Tuesdays and Fridays may not be ready until the next check out day.*
4. **Come** to the school's back parking lot during a pick-up time and I will have the books ready to check out for your student.



You can **return books** at these times as well.



Dear Everett Public Schools Family,

Everett Public Schools is offering **Transitional Kindergarten** for children who are age eligible and are not currently in an early learning program. The anticipated start date is February 4, 2021. Services, remote or in person, will be provided in alignment with the district learning model. **Transitional Kindergarten** will run through the last day of school, which is currently June 21, 2021

To be eligible for screening, children must:

- be 5 years old by August 31, 2021
- live within the boundaries of Everett Public Schools
- not be currently enrolled in an early learning program
- demonstrate academic and/or social-emotional needs

Start Date

The anticipated start date is **February 4, 2021**. Transitional Kindergarten will run through the last day of school, which is currently **June 21, 2021**. Services, remote or in person, will be aligned with the district learning model.



EARLY LEARNING OPPORTUNITY

Everett Public Schools is offering **Transitional Kindergarten** for children who are not currently in an early learning program and are age eligible to enter kindergarten in the fall of 2021. Students will be screened in December and January and may qualify based on need.

To be eligible for screening, children must:

- Demonstrate academic and/or social-emotional needs

Standards-based instruction, family engagement, professional development, and data and assessment supports are all part of the P-3 work.

We serve three primary groups in our community and schools: families of children birth through third grade, teachers of these students, and community organizations that serve these students and families. In all of this work, the P-3 goal is the optimum development of the whole child.

P-3 Early Learning Overview

Programs to engage and support students and families:

- **Play and Learn** is a school-year program for children birth through 5 years and their parents or caregivers. Together they engage in play-based learning that enhances brain development and supports school readiness. Contact: hcooley@everettsd.org
- **Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP)** is a comprehensive preschool program for income qualifying families. It includes preschool education, family support and health and nutrition services. Contact: jmadison2@everettsd.org
- **Transitional Kindergarten (TK)** is a second semester kindergarten program for children who will attend kindergarten in the fall. TK serves children within Everett Public Schools, who are not attending an early learning program, and demonstrate academic and/or social-emotional need. Contact: hcooley@everettsd.org
- **Everett Ready** is a five-day program in August offered to all students registered to attend kindergarten in the fall. Students have opportunities to become familiar with their school, meet and engage with teachers and classmates, and learn school and classroom routines to support success in kindergarten. Contact: rbachour2@everettsd.org
- **Washington Kindergarten Inventory of Developing Skills (WaKIDS)** is a transition process that contributes to a successful start to the K-12 experience and connects the key adults in a child's life. WaKIDS includes early learning collaboration, family connections, and a whole child assessment (social-emotional, cognitive, physical, language, literacy, math). Contact: gfleckenstein@everettsd.org
- **Early Entrance** is an optional process for parents to apply for their child to attend kindergarten or first grade prior to meeting the age requirements for school entry set by OSPI (for kindergarten five by August 31; for first grade six by August 31.) While offered to meet specific family needs, research does not show that early entrance is in a child's best interest. Contact: jmadison2@everettsd.org

P-3 Instructional Supports and Professional Development

- **Preschool to Kindergarten Connections** provides community and district preschool and kindergarten educators opportunities to meet throughout the school year to participate in learning and intentional collaboration around the development of the whole child and instructional best practices. - **P-3 Collaboration and Alignment Across Content** includes Writing Foundations, foundational reading skills and early math routines, to support aligned, standards based, and developmentally appropriate instruction. Contact: aarnold@everettsd.org

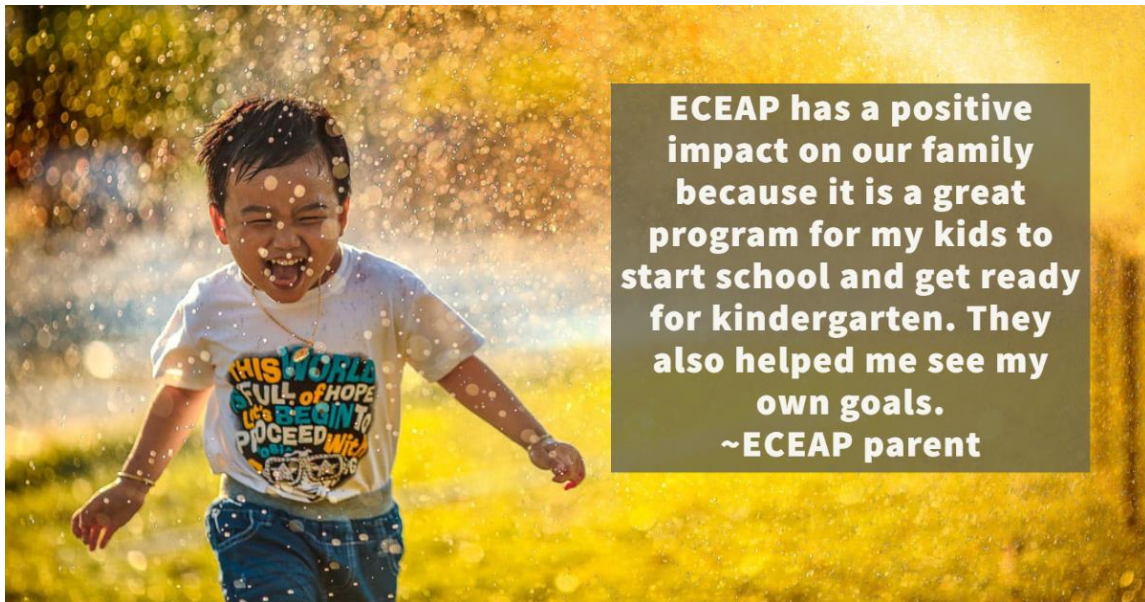
District Updates

ECEAP preschool is still enrolling for 2020-21

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and includes family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded in partnership with [Snohomish County Human Services](#) and [Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families](#).

ECEAP is providing remote preschool services this fall including virtual circle times and small groups, video libraries of fun, engaging activities, and learning materials for home-based activities. Additionally, ECEAP supports parents as their child's first and most important teacher through regular parent-teacher check-ins, family support coaching, resources, and online family support groups and informational classes.

The six ECEAP sites within our schools are Cedar Wood, Garfield, Hawthorne, Lowell, Madison and Silver Lake elementary schools. Additional community locations are available. Transitional Kindergarten Program

Everett Public Schools is offering a **Transitional Kindergarten** program this winter for children scheduled to enter kindergarten in the upcoming fall (2021). The program will focus on basic academic, social and self-help skills to jumpstart qualifying students toward success in school. Students will be screened in December and early January and may qualify based on ability and/or need. This program will be located at some of the elementary schools in our district or remote, depending on the current district learning plan; sites will be determined based on enrollment and space availability. The anticipated start date is February 4, 2021. **Transitional Kindergarten** will run through the last day of school, which is currently June 21, 2021.

To qualify for screening, children must:

- be 5 years old by August 31, 2021
- live within the boundaries of Everett Public Schools
- not be currently enrolled in an early learning program
- demonstrate academic and/or social-emotional needs

The parent inquiry form is available online. Families who are interested should visit the early learning website and submit the form





by December 6, 2020. For assistance or questions, contact Helen Cooley at 425-385-4088 or Early Learning at 425-385-4024.

Accepting Highly Capable nominations until Dec. 18

Find forms, information and evening events on the [Highly Capable website](#). Referrals are for students currently in grades one through four for winter testing, which will take place on February 6, 2021.

Delayed start or closed schools

If weather and road conditions call for closing school buildings, all learning will be cancelled, including remote learning. Remote learning must be cancelled because students who are learning in the building may not have their devices at home, and teachers who have been working in the building may not have the equipment or resources to teach from home.

If we must cancel school or delay the start of school, we will use our parent communication system to call in the morning, typically around 5:30 a.m., with a brief message about the reason for closure or delay. We will also use local media and post the message on our website. **If there is no announcement about Everett Public Schools, school is on the regular schedule.** More information and resources for school closures or delays is on the district website under the *Parents* tab.

ECEAP prepara a los niños para el kínder e incluye apoyo a las familias y servicios de salud y nutrición. Está financiado en asociación con [Snohomish County Human Services](#) y con [Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families](#).

ECEAP está proporcionando servicios de preescolar remotos este otoño que incluyen actividades virtuales de “circle time”, grupos pequeños, video librerías de diversión, actividades de participación y materiales de aprendizaje para realizar en casa. Además, ECEAP apoya a los padres para que sean los primeros y más importantes maestros de sus hijos a través de colaboraciones regulares entre los padres y maestros denominadas “check-ins”, entrenamiento para el apoyo familiar, recursos, y grupos de apoyo para familias en línea así como clases informativas.

Programa de Transición al Kínder (Transitional Kindergarten Program)

Las Escuelas Públicas de Everett están ofreciendo el **programa de transición al kínder** este invierno para niños que están programados a ingresar al kínder el próximo año escolar 2021 en otoño. El programa se concentrará en destrezas académicas básicas, autoayuda y destrezas sociales para arrancar a los alumnos calificados a que tengan éxito en la escuela. Los estudiantes serán valorados en diciembre y principios de enero y podrán calificar en base a sus habilidades y/o necesidades. Este programa estará localizado en algunas de las escuelas primarias en nuestro distrito o vía remota, dependiendo del plan de aprendizaje en el que esté el distrito. Los sitios serán determinados en base a la matriculación y espacio disponible. La fecha anticipada de inicio es el 4 de febrero de 2021. **El programa de transición al kínder** cubrirá y terminará hasta el último día escolar, que es actualmente el 21 de junio de 2021.

Para calificar para una valoración, el niño/a deberá:

- Tener 5 años de edad para el 31 de agosto de 2021.
- Vivir dentro de los límites escolares de las Escuelas Públicas de Everett.
- No estar actualmente inscrito en algún programa de aprendizaje temprano (early learning).
- Demostrar necesidades académicas y/o socioemocionales.
