From the Principal

Silver Lake Families,

March is finally here and we now have students back on our campus. Sights and sounds of students safely learning, engaging, and collaborating together in the building has been a long awaited and welcomed event. Thank you for being integral partners in our student's success by supporting and monitoring their learning.



On **March 1**, we will be launching into Phase 4a of our district's learning model. In this model, we will be welcoming students who have chosen the hybrid option this past fall. The students included in this phase are our

2nd and 3rd graders. Two weeks later on **March 15**, we will be welcoming our **4th and 5th grade hybrid students** in Phase 4b. We will provide more details and information for our 4th and 5th grade families in a separate communication. As a reminder, our **remote schedule has been adjusted to align our hybrid & remote specialist classes.** Your teachers will have more information about the schedule adjustment on their Canvas page.

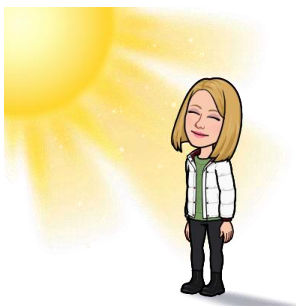

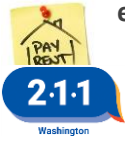


Counseling Corner



Anyone else wishing for that warmth from the sun, yet? Seattle winters are rough with the dark, rainy days, but I know that we Pacific Northwesterners really appreciate the sun when we get it! Bring on the Spring!

I have thoroughly enjoyed teaching Mindfulness once a week to all students. It is so inspiring to see students learning about how their brains work, what emotions they may be



experiencing, and mindful strategies to help them be in the “Green Zone” or what we call, “Ready to Learn.” In the next few weeks, you may see that your kids will be watching lessons from me on Bullying Prevention. I’m super excited to get this started in a “remote” way!

Please remember that you are welcome to contact me for any needs your family may have. This has been a tough year and navigating the resources available is not always easy.

Family Needs

With the eviction moratorium ending on March 31, we have many families that are worried about where they will live if they can’t pay the rent. **CARES Act money** that was expected in February was delayed and is now expected around March 1. If you need assistance for back rent owed, please call 2-1-1 to ask if you are eligible. Refer to the COVID-19 Family Needs & Resource List page on our school website for other assistance programs.

Community Resources

There are many resources available through community organizations to assist with basic needs. If your child needs clothing or school supplies, **please contact me**. I work with some community programs and have access to a Basic Needs fund.

Community Resources Insider Hints

In working to assist some of our families, I’ve learned a few things that you may find helpful:

When getting food from the [Mill Creek Food Bank](#), **make an appointment first**, either online or by calling the church. When arriving at your appointed time, get in the line of cars that are in the front parking lot of Gold Creek Community Church, closest to the road. There may be two lines of cars; choose either one. If you have an early timeslot, you may also see a line of cars for pre-school pick up at the back of the church. It is all very organized, and you will move into another line at the back by the food bank based on the number of people in your family needing food. A grocery cart will be wheeled over so you can unload it into your car. Return the cart and you are ready to leave.

When calling 2-1-1 to ask for help, you will first enter your zip code, which sends your call to our North Sound local agency of Volunteers of America. Assistance is available in English and in Spanish. **Be detailed in explaining your needs** so they can determine if you qualify for a particular program or assistance. For example, if you will be evicted in 14 days or less and have no place to go, there is a program set up to try to help you locate





housing. If you are already without a home and slept in your car or other temporary shelter last night, there is another program that you may qualify for assistance.

When calling 2-1-1, I learned that it is better to **leave a call-back number** when prompted than to stay on hold until someone answers. I receive much quicker responses that way.

Curbside Check Out at Silver Lake!

Hello families! Silver Lake started Curbside Check Out in 2020 and will continue in 2021!

Below is the process for putting books on hold & checking them out at Silver Lake Elementary.



1. Students can **place holds** through [Destiny Discover](#) on two books that are “in” as well as books that are “out”. If students are not sure how to place holds on books, please see [this video](#); email Mrs. Sand if you have further questions! If a student places a hold on a book that is “in”, I will pull that book off the shelf and label it for the student. *Please be careful because once you hold a book, you cannot unhold a book.* Contact Mrs. Sand if you need to take a book off of a hold.
2. You can **pick up** books starting Feb 8th
 - **Wednesdays** from 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.
 - **Fridays** from 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

3. Every Wednesday and Friday, **I will email Holds Ready notices so you will know if the hold is ready.** *Holds placed after noon on Wednesdays and Fridays may not be ready until the next check out day.*
4. **Come** to the school's back parking lot during a pick-up time and I will have the books ready to check out for your student.

You can **return books** at these times as well.

Kindergarten registration begins this month

Do you have a child who will be 5 years old by Aug. 31, 2021? Registration begins on March 1, 2021. During school building closure, you can complete enrollment forms for kindergarten [online](#)! A [step-by-step parent walkthrough video](#) is also available as a resource.



New for fall, 2021 is the dual-language Spanish immersion program at Emerson Elementary School. Families with children entering kindergarten will have the option to choose the dual language strand. This program gives elementary students an opportunity to complete the Everett Public Schools curriculum in a nontraditional and exciting way by immersing them in Spanish language and culture from kindergarten through twelfth grade. Students in the program will become proficient in both Spanish and English while learning the same curriculum content as their peers outside the program.

Priority will be given to students within the Emerson Elementary School attendance area. If a high number of students apply, a lottery will be conducted to select students. If the class is not filled from those in the Emerson attendance area, an additional lottery from beyond the school attendance area will be conducted.

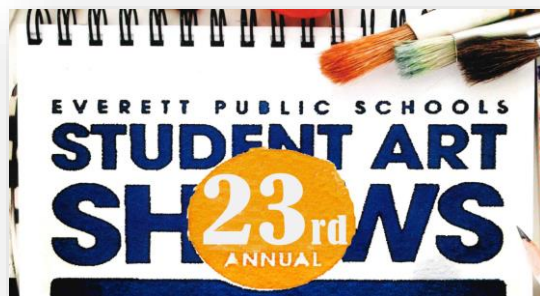

Remember to register to vote

By registering to vote, either in person or online, you can exercise a basic democratic right.

1. In person -- You may register to vote or change your registration at Snohomish County Elections, 3000 Rockefeller Ave, Everett, 1st Floor, Admin Bldg. West.
2. Online -- If you have a valid Washington state driver's license, you may register with the [Secretary of State](#) quickly and easily online. You may also download a voter registration form in several languages from that site.

El próximo otoño de 2021, tendremos un nuevo programa educativo de inmersión en idiomas duales con Español (dual-language Spanish immersion program) en la Escuela Primaria Emerson. Las familias con niños ingresando al kínder tendrán la opción de elegir este programa de idiomas duales. Este programa le da a los estudiantes de primaria de completar el plan de estudios de las Escuelas de Everett de una manera no tradicional y excitante a través de una inmersión en el idioma español y su cultura desde el kínder hasta



el 12^{vo} grado. Los estudiantes de este programa tendrán dominio del inglés y del español al mismo tiempo que aprenden el mismo contenido del plan de estudios que el de sus compañeros fuera de este programa.

Se les dará prioridad a los estudiantes dentro de la zona escolar de asistencia de la Escuela Primaria Emerson. Si resulta un alto número de aplicantes, se realizará una lotería para seleccionar a los estudiantes. Si el grupo no se completa con alumnos de la zona escolar de Emerson, se hará una lotería adicional fuera de la zona escolar de asistencia.

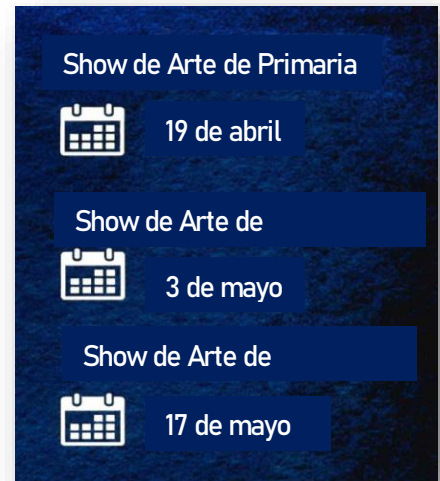
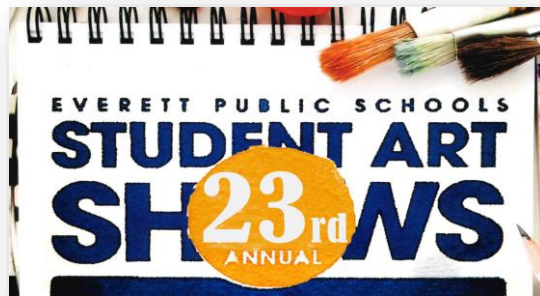
