- Go through their backpack each night, checking for homework to be completed or important papers/communications to be read.
- Review their planner just as they should, checking for any assignments due or long-term projects to begin.
- Read to or with them every day. A high level of independent reading is one of the key indicators of school success—plus it is fun!
- Help them review their spelling lists, ask them to identify their grade level sight words, or prepare for the next Topics test in math.
- If you have computer access, encourage them to use their RAZ or i-Ready account to help build their skill sets in reading and math.
- Talk with them about the importance of school and getting a solid foundation for learning. The good habits they establish now in elementary school will serve them well for years to come.
- Praise them when you read those great stories or see a good grade on their latest assessment. They need validation for the good work they are doing.

# Around the School with Mrs. Atregenio, School Counselor

Happy New Year! Since it is now January, I would like to look at how parents can encourage children to take

# responsibility and complete their homework ③.

Homework is important for the obvious reason that it provides practice to strengthen skills taught at school. Homework also teaches children responsibility by taking "ownership" of what is theirs, not their parents. In addition, it also teaches them about other life skills including time management, perseverance, self-reliance, and resourcefulness. In his book "Ending the Homework Hassle", John Rosemond suggests that parents need to be more of a consultant to their child rather than a participant. He goes on to state that "the parent-consultant stands on the sidelines, providing encouragement and support", rather than jumping in to "do it for" them. He goes on to talk about qualities of a consulting parent which include being available but not hovering, assigns responsibility rather than assumes it, encourages independence rather than dependence, and sends positive messages rather than negative. If you are struggling with supporting your child with homework, I suggest you pick up this book and read more. The author gives clear and do-able suggestions that are both helpful and rational. There are also questions posed with practical answers that clarify his points. The ultimate goal is to first teach children how to take responsibility for their own homework, then to support and encourage their efforts.

#### **MUSTANG MILERS STARTING JANUARY 5**

Mustang Milers is an optional before-school activity held on Friday mornings from 8:30-8:50 AM. If your child is interested, they first <u>need to have a signed permission slip turned in prior to participating</u>. At each session, students check in with one of the club advising teachers and then walk or jog. This is a fitness club or activity, where students can earn small tokens after completing miles by walking or jogging (5 miles = one token).

Students can join throughout the remaining school year. Students do not need to attend each Friday. It is held in most weather conditions with our undercover area as a rainy day course.

#### Snow routes are online!

# 2018 Capital Bond and Replacement Levy

The school board voted to propose a Capital Bond to meet future readiness needs and a Replacement Levy to replace the expiring one. If voters approve both the Capital Bond and Replacement Educational Programs and Operations Levy on Feb. 13, 2018, tax collections to complete those projects begin in 2019. That year the local school tax rate is projected to be \$4.89 per each \$1,000 of property value. That rate is the lowest local school tax rate for property owners in the district since 2013. # Support for students in temporary or inadequate housing

If your family is in a temporary or inadequate living situation due to a loss of housing or a family crisis, your child may be eligible for certain educational rights and services. If you lost your housing and now live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, camping ground, temporary trailer, on the street, doubled up with family or friends, or in another type of temporary or inadequate housing, your child might be able to receive help through a federal law called the McKinney-Vento Act. The McKinney-Vento Act may be able to provide support through transportation so that your child can continue enrolled in school, or through access to programs and services so that your child can participate fully in school.
