Safety and Bicycle Rodeo Planned for May 4th

FRIDAY, MAY 4 - 5:30-7:00 P.M.

Silver Lake Elementary (12815 Bothell-Everett Hwy) is hosting their first Safety and Bicycle Rodeo on **Friday** evening, May 4. The event goes from **5:30-7:00 p.m. in the back parking lot**. There will be various bicycle courses and stations related to safety and bicycling. Open to the public; cars will need to use the front lot directly of the Bothell-Everett Hwy. There are a limited number of free helmets to be fitted and given to



participating children, plus some bicycles will be available for loan during the rodeo. **Volunteers are needed**. For information, please call the school at 425-385-6900.

BIKE SAFETY TIPS

Talk with children about bike helmets and bike safety. **Bumps and bruises heal but a head injury can be forever.** Kids learn by example, so set a good one by always wearing a helmet every time you go bicycling. A **bike helmet is the single most effective safety device for reducing head injury and death from biking mishaps**.

Did You Know?

- Short rides close to home can be the most dangerous
- More than 60 percent of childhood bicycle-related fatalities occur on small neighborhood roads. The typical bike crash occurs within a single mile of home.

10 Tips for Safe Bike Riding

- 1) Check your brakes, tire pressure & chain before you start.
- 2) Properly put your helmet on never ride without one.
- 3) Be visible. Wear light and bright colors during the day. At night, use a headlight and taillight, and wear white or reflective clothing.
- 4) Cars, bikes and pedestrians must obey traffic laws. Know who has the right of way for every situation.
- 5) Do not weave in and out of parked cars.
- 6) Always stop and check traffic before riding into the street.
- 7) Obey all traffic signs and signals.
- 8) Always use hand signals.
- 9) Ride on the right side of the street.
- 10) Always be alert and pay attention watch for traffic and obstacles.

FACT: A bicycle helmet reduces the risk of serious head and brain injury by 85-88%.

For one week, American Red Cross representatives are guest teachers visiting each Physical Education class from April 30-May 4. The curriculum will include hands-on examples and every student will receive a small first aid kit. Ask your child about what they learned.



Silver Lake Mustang Milers Updates

Students arrive before school on Friday mornings to walk or jog laps for cardiorespiratory fitness as an elective activity. Every 5 miles of exercise earns them a small foot token. New school accountability system

In the new accountability system launched this spring, schools are measured on assessment proficiency, student growth, graduation rates, English Learner progress, and school climate indicators, including attendance, dual credit opportunities, and 9th graders on track to graduation. Those guidelines are called the Washington School Improvement Framework and they are intended to help families understand a fuller picture of school success. The district's 2017-18 Washington School Improvement Framework results are available on the <u>OSPI Report Card</u>.

Next year's calendar

The calendar for next school year is part of the negotiations process with the teachers' bargaining unit. Negotiations for that contract have begun. During negotiation years, it's not unusual for those talks to continue into late August. In the past, we have traditionally started school the Wednesday after Labor Day, which would be Sept. 5 this year. The district will use the website, email, phone, text messaging and social media to announce the calendar when contract negotiations are complete.

Summer school registration is open!

<u>Registration materials are now online</u>. Summer programs for high school students include opportunities to strengthen the skills and knowledge required for the district core expectations, repeat courses, extend their interests in academic areas, and take new



courses. Tuition-based summer programs are offered for students through Online High School and at Cascade High School. Elementary and middle school summer programs are available for specific students who need academic support.

Before- and after-school care

Many parents rely on before- and after-school childcare to help juggle busy schedules. Currently, YMCA provides before- and after-school care at six elementary schools and the Boys & Girls Club provides care at one school.

The district is in the process of soliciting applications from vendors to provide before- and after-school care at more elementary schools to provide greater flexibility and more choice for parents, and to increase student enrichment opportunities.

Let's talk about growth



Since the 2018 Capital Bond proposal did not meet the 60 percent supermajority needed to pass in February, the school board is reviewing results and determining next steps to manage high school growth until a new high can be built. Three community conversations are scheduled this May to share information on implications of high school overcrowding and to gather input on options to manage this growth in the near future.

If so, the elementary school your child will attend may change beginning fall 2019 when the new Elementary School 18 opens at 4419 180th St. SE, Bothell.

A committee of parents and principals representing each of these schools has been studying current boundaries and recently recommended modifications to the superintendent.



Review the recommendation and share your thoughts through the website until May 25. The superintendent will review input and make a recommendation to the school board on June 19. The board is expected to finalize boundaries in fall 2018 – a year prior to the new school's opening. Boundaries changes will go into effect September 2019.
