From the Principal

A new month is upon us, and it's a big one! On Jan. 19, we welcomed our Life Skills students back in person. Now we are preparing to bring some of our students in kindergarten, first grade, and our Extended Resource Room program (ExRR) back in person in a hybrid model on Feb. 8 or 11 (depending on A/B groups). We are also excited to welcome a new program, Transitional Kindergarten (TK)! For students in Grades 2-5, learning continues 100% remote at this time. Whether you are staying remote or coming in person, our goal is that every child continues to experience a caring learning community and strong instruction that meets their needs.

For our families with students in TK/K/1/ExRR, our teachers are hard at work collaborating to **ensure the strongest possible transition** for every child, whether they are changing classes, modes, or both. The rest of our staff is making sure all of our systems – arrival/dismissal, lunch/recess, transitions, etc. – will run smoothly and safely. We will be following all district procedures around COVID-19 prevention.

For those families transitioning to hybrid, please be sure to check our website, where you can find information on what the day will look like, how things like busing and meals will work, and links to additional Everett Public Schools resources such as the Family Safety Handbook. Very, very important for hybrid families is the quarterly health screening attestation form, which you'll find at the end of this newsletter. With this form, you pledge to screen your child daily for COVID-19 symptoms or exposure before sending them to school. Getting this form back to us BEFORE Feb. 8 or 11 will allow your child to start the first day with their class, rather than needing to be screened at school or dig the form out of their backpack before entry time. Please either drop off a completed hard copy (which we have in the office if needed), or sign and scan yours to lstrzelec@everettsd.org.

Being stuck in self-isolation isn't ideal. Here are fun things to do at home to make dealing with COVID-19 just a little more bearable for the whole family.





Kindergarten registration begins in March



COVID-19 Health Screening Attestation January – March 2021

IMPORTANT NOTICE: All students, staff members, or visitors who enter our schools or facilities must attest that they have no symptoms of COVID-19 and/or that they have not been in close contact with someone who has been confirmed or suspected positive with COVID-19.

PLEASE REVIEW THE FOLLOWING COVID-19 SYMPTOMS:

- Temperature greater than 100.4° F
- Persistent cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Chills
- Unusual fatigue
- Muscle and body aches

- New onset of severe headache
- Sore throat
- Sudden loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea/vomiting or diarrhea

CLOSE CONTACT / POTENTIAL EXPOSURE:

- Within the past 10 days, has your child had a positive COVID-19 test for active virus?
- Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told you to monitor, isolate, or quarantine your child because of concerns about COVID-19 infection?
- Within the past 14 days, has your child been in close physical contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19?

By signing this form, I am affirming that I will check my child daily for all symptoms of COVID-19. I also agree not to send my child to school if they have any symptoms, if they have had close contact with someone with COVID-19, if they have tested positive for COVID-19, or if they have been told to self-monitor, isolate, or quarantine.
