Very few can exemplify perseverance and resolve better than Nathan Brooks, an  $11^{th}$ -grade wrestler at Henry M. Jackson High School. Nathan is having a fantastic season this year, with a winning record and top-three finishes in several tournaments. However, success was never something that was merely handed to him.

Nathan wrestled all throughout his freshman and sophomore year without securing a single win. While most would be hesitant to return to wrestling for a third year, it was never a question for Nathan. "I knew my teammates were counting on me to come back. Instead of thinking about the grueling practices or the results of my matches, I chose to see the positives in the sport and all the fun experiences that I've shared with my team," he said.

This past December, Nathan won third place in the Wilfong Tournament in Tulalip, which he considers as one of the proudest achievements of his season. When asked about this victory, Nathan said,

Part of Nathan's new mindset can be attributed to how his junior year gave him a fresh perspective on his sports career in high school, and how it shaped his approach to this year. "If I could say something to myself in freshman or sophomore year, it would be not to wait. I used to tell myself that I had the rest of high school to get my goals done or to achieve things I wanted. This made me put off things like going to the gym and putting my max effort into practice. Going into my junior season, I realized I only had this year and the next year before graduating, and that was a sort of wake-up call for me to do things differently," Nathan said.

Nathan's head coach, Matthew McClinchy, expressed his pride for Nathan's accomplishments in wrestling over the past few years: "Nathan Brooks has been Jackson's Varsity heavyweight wrestler since his freshman year. He entered his junior season without a single varsity win. In the second dual of this season against Archbishop Murphy, he recorded his very first Varsity win and has been on a hot streak ever since," he says.

"Nathan has continued to rack up win after win this season, placing top 3 in the Wilfong invitational tournament, Snohomish Panther classic tournament, and was 3 points away from placing top 8 in the prestigious Pacific Coast Championship in Vancouver, Washington. Nathan's success this season has been the result of his perseverance and refusal to be discouraged."

As Nathan reflects on his recent successes, he acknowledges the importance of maintaining self-esteem throughout the highs and lows of his athletic journey, in addition to the hardworking mindset he continues to sustain. "I hear people saying that you either have or don't have a work ethic, which is something I don't agree with. Some days I do feel low motivation, but I always make sure to stick through with it no matter how tough it gets," he says. "I have a certain self-respect for myself that makes me never want to quit because I'll always feel that I could've done better if I don't see things through till the end."

With the drive and determination that Nathan holds, it's clear that he'll find continued success for the rest of his junior season and in his senior year. The future looks bright for Nathan, and we're excited to see what it brings for the rest of his wrestling career at Jackson.






## **Track & Field Highlights**
