

What Vikings do on day one when they arrive at school!

If you arrive by bus, your driver will let you off at the back of the school. Get off



the bus, enter through the gates and find your teacher name posted on one of the pillars or against a fence or wall. Ask a staff member if you need help finding your class line! Stay in line while you wait for the bell and for your teacher to come out, greet you, and take you into school to start your day! This is the routine all bus riders will follow everyday!

If you arrive with parents by car and your parents will use the parent drop



off queue, stay in your car until your parent has safely stopped in the drop off zone. We will have patrol and staff helping guide cars (do not get out of your car until you are in the drop off zone!). Once safely out of the car, walk to the main entrance, go through the doors, and go through the school to enter the back

playground to find your teacher's line. Stay in line while you wait for the bell and for your teacher to come out, greet you, and take you into school to start your day! This is the routine all car riders will follow everyday!

If you arrive with parents and will walk up to school with

them, the first day will be the only day we will allow parents to enter with you! DO NOT GO TO YOUR CLASSROOM! Walk to the back playground with your parents to find your class line.



Stay in line while you wait for the bell and for your teacher to come out, greet you, and take you into school to start your day! Every parent except our kindergarten parents should say goodbye to you at the playground. You are starting school and we have important things to start with you. Parents are not

allowed to walk to the classroom. Starting on day two, only students should enter the building in the morning to start their day. Students will know by day two how to line up on the playground. Any parents wishing to come to school will need to follow our expectations for all visitors as printed in our handbook and first day packets!
