

# German 2 Students Going to San Francisco!

This year, the German 2 students participated in a trivia competition with schools from across the USA, Canada, and Mexico. The students had to answer questions based on videos they watched in German about games in the Bundesliga (German soccer league). The Cascade Bären (Bruins) finished in second place in the West region, meaning two students, Micah Hogan and Mason Gonzalez, will be traveling to San Francisco to take part in the regional playoff against the other top finishers, with the winner receiving a free trip to Germany to watch a live soccer match!

#### **German Student Earns Gold!**

For the second year in a row, senior Alex Smith earned a "gold level" score on the National German Exam. This exam is administered across the nation to more than 25,000 German language students. Last year, Alex had the highest score in Washington State! In order to qualify for the study abroad award, students must score in the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile or higher. Alex has submitted his application to the national organization and after the interview process, he will learn if he gets to go to Germany this summer as the recipient of the study abroad award. This is an amazing achievement since Alex took the Level 4 test, which is the most difficult. We are so proud of Alex!






### **Lost and Found!**

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
### Kindergarten registration happening now
