# From the Principal

Dear Cascade Families,

As we move into 2019, I want to share my gratitude for the support of the entire community in 2018 and look forward to what lies ahead in 2019.

The beginning of this school year began with the distribution of laptop computers to each one of our students. The support of the community made this possible. Our students have access to so much more than they could without the technology. We continue to learn alongside the students as we ensure they are ready for post-secondary education and careers which will increasingly require their ability to create and collaborate both inperson and online. Thank you for your support of all our students!

- We have begun a Multilingual Ambassador Student (MAS) program for bilingual students who can provide support for new students and families in our community.
- We will have a Multicultural Night Celebration on March 20 to celebrate and honor the diverse backgrounds of our students and families.

Every year, the Cascade community comes together to put together this large-scale event. By reaching out to our neighbors, collecting food outside stores, and connecting with local organizations, we were able to bring in enough food, money, and gifts to serve over 200 families in our community. This year, our totals were 79,432 Cans, \$29,884 and 1850 Gifts! Our food drive could not happen without the constant support of our staff, families, and other community members at Cascade. To you all -- thank you!

In other ASB happenings, our ASB Ambassador, Airam Lopez, has taken on the task of recognizing students at our school in a public way. We believe that the best way for students to truly connect with their campus is by seeing themselves on and around our campus. To the left is a wall in our cafeteria with students' pictures being featured. This is one of the many efforts to highlight students we have planned for this year!



This month, the Cascade community experienced the loss of Laurie Cappello, our choir teacher of 17 years. It is with my greatest sympathies that we honor her presence and service here at Cascade. Her love, passion and knowledge of music inspired individuals beyond the walls of our school; her warm presence had no boundaries. Her life was celebrated at the Cascade Holiday Concert that was dedicated in her name. On behalf of the Cascade students, we say thank you.

### Cascade's 57th Food Drive has Come to a Close!

Here are some stats from this year's food drive:

#### GIFTS: Over 1850 brought in for 323 children and 30 elderly adults

52 classes brought in gifts, ranging from 1 to 301!

37 classes had 10 or more gifts; 10 classes had 50 or more gifts!

#### **CANNING:**

Students canned at 11 different stores for over 1,000 hours. If you consider that most students canned in pairs or groups of 3-4, the collective hours at the stores could be as high as 4000 hours -- that is 166 DAYS of CANNING!

#### **OTHER AWESOME THINGS:**

We were the recipients of several very generous donations from our community businesses:

<u>Emerson Elementary</u>: Students at Emerson Elementary donated a van full of food that they have collected during the food drive. They also came to Cascade during shopping day to help sort out the donations that they collected.



<u>Don, Jan and Megan Jensen</u> donated 200 turkeys on behalf of the Brett Akio Jensen Memorial Scholarship fund, in memory of their son Brett who was a 2001 graduate of Cascade High School, ASB President, and a passionate student who loved the food drive!

<u>ZUMIEZ Foundation</u>- donated two pallets full of winter jackets, beanies, socks, gloves, and hoodies to distribute to our families. Mr. Therrell, a staff alumni of Cascade High School who was passionate about the food drive, has set it up so that Cascade High School Food Drive will receive this generous donation each year.

#### Safeway/Albertsons -

Awarded us a \$15,000 grant to purchase items that are guaranteed for each of our families, including: turkeys, toilet paper, paper towels, stuffing, potatoes, onions, carrots, eggs, butter, bread, and baby items. They coordinated the logistics between their distribution centers and various stores to arrange a semi-truck full of Hunger Bag product and our perishable items as well as 50 shopping carts for us to use on shopping day.

#### **SHOPPING and WRAPPING DAY:**

Over 300 students, 40+ alumni, and numerous staff helped to coordinate the Wrapping Day in the Library and Shopping Day in the gym. We boxed up food and wrapped gifts for over 160+ families, 30 of which are families of our Cascade students. The food required over 1,100 boxes and I wish we counted how many rolls of wrapping paper were used. I'll try to get that number next year.:)

Jill Jackson and Trish Roberts oversaw the massive undertaking of Shopping Day in the library, with the support of many staff members and classrooms who came into wrap up the gifts for those 350+ children and adults. (Thank you to Himstedt, Taylor, Worthington, Lockwood, Bohannon, McMenamy, Knoefler, Coon, Vasquez, Cole, Collins, Johnson and Pimenta for making it all happen!)

Trish executed a methodic \$500 Fred Meyer shopping trip to buy supplemental gifts for the ages/genders that we needed to complete our gifts for families.

We finished sorting food just after 2pm. Thank you for helping your students pre-sort their boxes. This makes this day so efficient for our students!

Mr. Hull, Ms. Hodgins, Mr. Bertrand, Mr. Huizinga and Mr. Schmidt brought in their PE classes during the day to help unload all the pallets off of the Safeway semi truck and helped us sort out the nearly 80,000 food items in the gym!

Ms. Woods generously donated the most amazing photo booth to have at Shopping Day. Kat (Selby) Chin, a 2001 CHS alumni and former food drive chair, donated her time to run the photo booth during shopping day. Carole Woods made a fantastic shopping guide so our students had an idea of how many food items to collect for their families. Rachel Raine and Leslie Sutin (Sequoia HS) helped label each of the 1,100 boxes and told students the details about the families they were shopping for. Claire Wambold and DaVena Clark roamed the shopping aisle to guide students in packing their boxes efficiently so families received a wonderful amount of food and so the boxes were ready for delivery the next day. Rhonda Covert, Michelle Crews, and CHS Alumni Spencer Bowlden oversaw the placement of the packaged food for each of the families and organizations. Fitting 1,100 boxes in to ½ of the gym is no easy task, but they manage to do it flawlessly year after year!

#### **DELIVERY DAY:**

160 students and 30 alumni departed in  $\sim$ 50 vehicles to deliver food to our families and food banks. We had the gym cleaned and swept by 1:30pm, in time for athletics to use the gym.

Ron Hicks volunteered to shuttle the vans that we fill with turkeys, eggs and butter to keep cold at night, and also drives students who signed up to deliver as "solo riders".



We sent a crazy amount of extra food, gifts, and baby items to 5 area food banks, including Volunteers of America, Salt of the Earth, YWCA, Family Tree Apartments and ESD ECAP Preschool.

The extra clothing and gifts also we distributed to: Hand in Hand food basket program Cascade Food/Clothing Closet Evergreen MS Clothing Closet Madison Elementary Backpack program Emerson Elementary clothing closet Sequoia High School


### German Career Booster Day!



to answer students' questions. Of course, it was also inspiring to be on the University of Washington campus and soak up the college atmosphere.








# Save the Date: Cascade Culture Night on March 20

# **Congratulations to CHS Crimson Cheerleaders!**


Cascade High School Crimson Cheerleaders competed at the Jamz Washington State Championships, where we were competing for a Nationals spot. We competed in two categories:
