STAYING CONNECTED

The start of the school year is a big time of transition in the lives of families. As parents of teens, we often wonder how to support our kids while letting them learn independence and take responsibility for their lives. The following is an excerpt from Aha! Parenting (an on-line parenting website, created by Dr. Laura Markham, Clinical Psychologist) that reminds us of the importance of staying connected to our teenagers.



Staying Connected to Your Teen

"We need to rethink the old metaphor of separating from our teens and replace it with the concept of extension. That is, during adolescence, teenagers need to extend away from their parents, all the while staying connected to their parents. Their job is to extend; your job is to connect." - Michael Riera

In the United States, we often make a cultural presumption that teens and young adults who are close to their parents are less independent in their lives. That's not true, says recent research. In fact, young adults who feel they can share honestly with their parents say they feel free to make independent decisions and don't feel the need to rebel against their parents' expectations.

Our job as parents is to meet our kids' emotional needs at each stage of their development so they can advance to the demands of the next stage. In the teen years, everything we've done right and wrong comes into sharp focus. If we've accepted our child's dependency needs AND affirmed her development into her own separate person, she'll stay connected to us even as her focus shifts to peers, high school and the passions that make her soul sing.

It's appropriate for kids to become increasingly independent throughout their teen years. But it's critical, for most of those years, for parents to remain their teen's emotional and moral compass. Kids will begin to experiment with intimate relationships outside the family, but to do that successfully, they still rely on those intimate relationships at home remaining solid.

We need to invite our children to rely on us emotionally until they're emotionally ready to depend on themselves. Too often, in our culture, we let teenagers transfer their dependency outside the family, with disastrous results. Teens often give up a great deal of themselves in pursuit of the closeness they crave, only to crash against the hard reality that other teens aren't developmentally able to offer them what they need. The biggest predictor of how early your child will become sexually active? The closer she is to you and her other parent, the longer she'll wait.

It is NOT a sign of healthy emotional development for a teen to push parents away, or for parents to let him. That's a sign of a damaged relationship. Attempting to parent when your relationship with your teen is damaged is like pushing a boulder uphill. It's never too late in your relationship with your child to do repair work, to move closer. But it's a whole lot harder to build the strong connection you want if the foundation isn't there.





Attendance Policies

Welcome to the 2017-2018 school year. Please read the information below outlining the CHS Attendance procedures.

To excuse an absence or tardy, please use the following e-mail address:

chsattendance@everettsd.org

1. Written notes (paper) or an e-mail to chsattenddance@everettsd.org are required to excuse a student's absence. You can also send a fax to (425) 385-6002 to excuse your student.

Upon arriving to school, late or leaving early students are required to sign in and sign out of the Attendance Office. If a student is late to school, even if it is during passing time or lunchtime, they are required to come to the Attendance Office to sign in and receive a pass to class.

Students are not permitted to leave school or meet a parent in the parking lot. For safety reasons, parents/guardians on record with the school must come into the Attendance Office to sign out their students.

If a student leaves school without permission and without signing out in the Attendance Office, their absences will remain **unexcused**.

<u>Do NOT text or call your student during class to have them leave</u>. Teachers do not allow students to leave unless the Attendance Office calls to authorize it.

- 2. Students must turn in their notes to excuse previous absences, early dismissals, bus notes, written by a parent, by 10:00 a.m. in the morning. If your student forgets to turn in their absence note, they are welcomed and encouraged to bring it the next morning.
- 3. <u>Notes must be turned in within 30 days after a student returns back to school</u>, not including holidays or weekends, in order to have the absence excused. Notes

turned in past the 30-day timeframe will be accepted; however, the absence is not excused and will be coded with *LN* for *late note*.

- 4. IF you receive a phone call saying your student was marked absent in a class and they say to you, "I was there," please contact the teacher directly about this discrepancy or have your students stop by the attendance office for a pink Attendance Correction Request slip. The student will need to take care of this with the teacher who marked them absent. The teacher is the only one that can give permission to change an absence that is deemed a "mistake" as they are the only one who can verify if a student was in class, in the wrong seat or tardy. The 30 day policy or before 10:00 a.m. policy does not apply for fixing these mistakes.
- 5. If your student is out of school <u>over 5 days due to illness</u>, a <u>doctor's note is</u> required to excuse the <u>absence</u>. Homework can be requested for students out sick over 3 days. Please be aware that we require 24 hour's notice to teachers for homework collection. You are welcome to email teachers directly to request schoolwork.
- 6. **Pre-Arranged absence request:** If your student is going to be out of school due to vacations, surgeries, tournaments, appointments, etc., a pre-arranged absence form is required. These forms are found on-line or in the attendance office. This must be filled out by the student and signed by all teachers along with parent/guardian. The Principal will review and consider all Pre-Arranged absence requests before approval.
- 7. PLEASE know what time your student has lunch or is in a PE class. It is <u>not</u> possible to find your student during lunch and extremely difficult to find them during <u>PE</u>. If you have to pick them up during either of these times, please send a note with your student asking for them to be dismissed at a specific time. Your student will bring that note to the attendance office before school begins to pick up a pass that will allow them to meet you at the attendance office at the time specified.
- 8. Please remember that if your student missed the bus, overslept or is running late, or had car trouble, the absence <u>WILL NOT</u> be excused.
- 9. The following excuses are considered valid and acceptable per the Everett School District Attendance Policy:
