From the Principal

Welcome to October! It's been a great first month of school and your children have been hard working, engaged, and passionate learners. Thank you for your support in helping to ensure that your child has a successful start to the new school year. Thank you for attending our Back-to-School Orientation, Meet the Teacher Day, PTA 1st day of school coffee (K-5), Back-to-School BBQ, September PTA meeting, and Whittier Curriculum Night. Your support always matters!

The Everett Public Schools' High School and Beyond Week will take place October 8-12. Everett High School will be hosting the "Mapping your Future: What you Can Do Now to Chart your Course" evening seminar for north Everett families on Wednesday, October 10, from 5:00-8:00pm at Everett High School to highlight this important focus. Whittier will be supporting this district focus by having a "Favorite College/University Spirit Day" this Friday, October 5, to emphasize the importance of being life-long learners. We will also have a "Dress Your Best for Success Spirit Day" the following week on Friday, October 12, to stress the importance of presenting yourself in a professional manner when preparing for a career and interviewing for a job.

Our first and second grade teachers are currently administering the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA), while our third through fifth grade teachers are administering the i-Ready reading. Both assessment tools provide teachers with excellent information to show us your child's reading progress. Please take the time to listen to your child read and/or read to them every day. Reading is the number one skill for success in school and a significant indicator for success in life. Your child's teacher will provide their reading assessment results during our fall parent-teacher conference week which will take place November 5-9.

Whittier is currently receiving support from the state funded Learning Assistance Program (LAP). The LAP program is designed to provide supplemental support to eligible students who are identified as in need of additional assistance to meet state and local academic standards, particularly focusing on children in kindergarten through fourth grade who are below grade level in reading. Support may also be provided for fifth grade students and in math. If you have questions about the LAP program and how it can support your child, please contact me to discuss your learning concerns for your child.

Illness/health condition or medical appointment, Family emergency, Religious or cultural purpose, Court/judicial, Student's homeless status or foster care/dependency, Principal and parent/guardian mutually agreed upon approved activity, Absence due to student safety concern, Deployment activities of apparent or legal guardian, Absence resulting from disciplinary action, suspension, expulsion, emergency expulsion, Absence due to migrant status.

Finally, I wanted to emphasize to parents that student safety is the highest priority at Whittier. Please remember that the Whittier campus doors are locked until 8:10 a.m. Please do not drop your child off before 8:10 a.m. as we do not have supervision for students outside of the entrance or outside of the playground fence area in the morning. Thank you for your support.



If the parent/guardian submits an excuse statement (reason, explanation) more than thirty (30) calendar days after the absence
edule an informational attendance conference with the parent/guardian after five excused absences within a month (if not previously nged approval from the school principal) to take steps in providing resources and support to reduce or eliminate all absences.

A truancy petition may be filed if the student has ten excused absences within the school year.

A truancy petition may be filed if the student has five unexcused absences within one month or within the school year.



- Letters informing parents/guardians of excessive tardies will be sent home.
- Students arriving after 9:06 a.m. will be marked as absent for a half day.
- Students missing 50% of their school day will be marked as absent for a full day.
- When twenty consecutive days of school are missed, the student will be withdrawn from the district. If the registrar does not receive a request for records within ten days of withdrawal, a BECCA petition will be filed.

Delayed start or closed schools

If we have to cancel school or delay the start of school, we will use our parent communication system to call in the morning, typically around 5:45 a.m., with a brief message about the reason for closure or delay. We will also use local media and post the message on our website. If there is no announcement about Everett Public Schools, school is on the regular schedule. Back-to-school safety reminders

YouTube Lets Parents Handpick Videos Their Kids Can See


YouTube is taking some extra steps to give parents more control over what their children watch.

In a <u>blog post today</u>, YouTube announced two updates to their <u>YouTube Kids</u> app to improve user experience for the <u>millions of children and parents</u> who use the app.

The biggest update, which YouTube <u>first introduced in April</u>, is the rollout of parent-approved content. Android users around the world can handpick every video or channel their child is allowed to view through the YouTube Kids app (this ability is forthcoming soon to users on iOS devices).

Now, with a single settings change — simply click "approved content only" on each child's profile — parents can make sure their children only watch the content that they've manually selected.





Parents can also include playlists curated by trusted partners, such as PBS Kids, Sesame Street, and humans on the YouTube Kids team (not an algorithm!).

The "approved content only" setting disables the app's search function, as well.

Now that it's been <u>almost four years</u> since YouTube Kids launched, YouTube is aware that its target audience is getting older. It's launched a new feature for kids aged 8 to 12 that lets parents select an "Older" setting that opens up age-appropriate content geared towards their interests: music videos and video game content, for example.

YouTube has seen its <u>share of bad publicity</u> with its kids app, primarily as a result of questionable content — <u>sometimes creepy</u>, other times <u>disturbing</u> (particularly the "<u>Johny Johny Yes Papa</u>" phenomenon) — that has found its way onto the app, a place YouTube intended to be a safe space for kids to watch content.

YouTube admits in its blog post that "no system is perfect" and encourages parents to flag inappropriate videos. But with these latest updates, it seems that YouTube Kids is certainly moving in the right direction.
