Communication about Student Learning

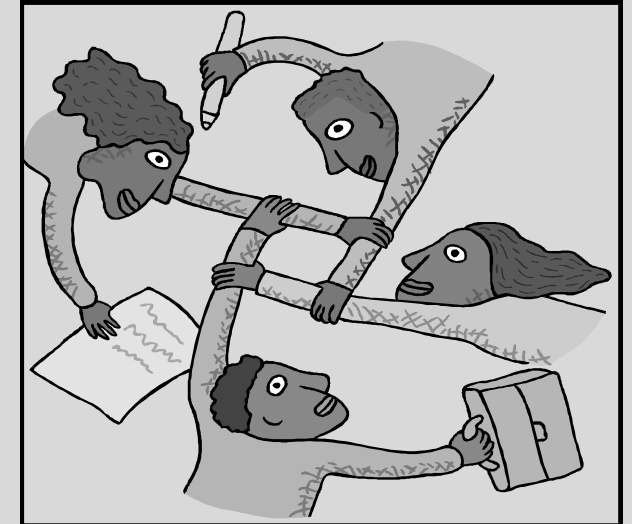
Lowell Elementary is committed to communicating regularly about your child's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

Teachers, Parents, Students - Together for Success

In Our 1st Grade Classroom

The 1st Grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in math and reading. We will:

- Math Counting: Teach and model counting out loud by 1s, 5s, 10s to at least 120., and by 2s to 40.
- Math Combinations: Practice number combinations or facts to 10., beginning with addition.
- Reading: Post sight words, and use them in conversation.
- Reading Recognition: Work on sight word flashcards for recognition and spelling.
- Commit to incorporate the at-home activities as part of the regular classroom homework.

At Home

Lowell parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in math and reading.

For Math:

- Practice counting out loud by 1s, 5s, 10s to 120. and by 2s to 40. Practice counting on a 100s Chart.
- Practice math facts - orally or using flashcards or websites.

For Reading:

- Review sight words on a daily basis, check the words your child has mastered.
- Play games identifying sight words each day.
