


Throw 10 Snowballs:

Make "snowballs" from paper (or any way you like), then place them in a bucket at one end of the room. Start kids out by having them toss snowballs into another bucket until they reach 10 (or any target number). Count with your student as they throw them, or have them count as they throw if they are able. Ask "how many?" questions to help them built quantity concepts.





Collect things from around the house and have your child match them with the shape page you have created. If your student is not able to match them, you can do it with them and label the shapes you are finding and use words like "the same" "match" and then have them attempt after several models completed by you.

Build a Forest Counting



Have your child make the tree as tall as the number on the trunk, have them read the number and count the triangle they add until they reach the number. Ask them questions about "how many?" "what's the total?" "what number comes next?" and have them use one to one correspondence:
