Please allow students some creative/game playing time as well. I will be uploading links on Google Classroom to help with this.

12:30 - 1:00 p.m	Chore Time/Exercise	Work on any chores you've been asked to do, go for another walk, etc.
1:00 - 2:30 p.m.	Quiet Time	Independent reading (AR, Book Clubs), puzzles, nap
2:30 - 4:00 p.m.	Academic Time	iReady, Prodigy, finish Daily Learning Opportunities on Google Classroom
