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Course Objectives: Beginning sequence of courses to practice functional elements of German pronunciation, grammar and culture in the context of practical conversational German. Listening, speaking, reading and writing to communicate in a logical, natural and personalized way.

Areas of Assessment:

- 1. Students demonstrate engagement in active learning through a variety of assignments, including group participation, written and oral presentations.
- Students comprehend information from different types of oral and written sources in the target language and give written and oral presentations, reflecting their understanding of those topics.
- Students interact with native speakers, when possible, and participate in target-language cultural events. Students demonstrate an awareness of and appreciation for a culture other than their own, through written and oral presentations, and when available, study abroad/exchange programs.
