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Course Objectives: Continuation of GERM& 121, 122 and 123. By the end of this year, you will be able to speak and understand German well enough to live in a German speaking country. Our goal is proficiency in spoken and written German with emphasis on German vocabulary, grammatical structures and communication skills. Hopefully, you will consider studying in Germany at some point in your life. Right now is the best time to do so, since enrollment fees are still very low and German Universities are eager to enroll foreign students.

Note that this course covers three terms of EvCC. AP is a rigorous curriculum which will cover all of the following.

Students in German 223 will:

- Acquire proficiency in the five skills of language learning: reading, writing, speaking, understanding and culture.
- Review old and learn new grammatical structures of German: Nominative, Accusative, Dative, Genitive case; der-words, ein-words; masculine N-nouns; personal pronouns; demonstrative pronouns; indefinite pronouns; interrogative pronouns; accusative, dative and genitive prepositions; time expressions; adverbs and adjective endings; present perfect tense, past perfect tense and simple past tense; infinitive sentences; comparatives and superlatives; da and wo composite; reflexive verbs and pronouns; relative clauses and relative pronouns; was, wen, wer as relative pronouns; idiomatic verb and preposition construction; ...
- Discover another lifestyle and culture and to become culturally aware and sensitive.
- Become more aware of one's own language and culture by studying a foreign one

Areas of Assessment:

- 1. Students demonstrate engagement in active learning through a variety of assignments, including group participation, written and oral presentations.
- Students comprehend information from different types of oral and written sources in the target language and give written and oral presentations, reflecting their understanding of those topics.
- 3. Students interact with native speakers, when possible, and participate in target-language cultural events. Students demonstrate an awareness of and appreciation for a culture other than their own, through written and oral presentations, and when available, study abroad/exchange programs.
- 4. Students lead presentations on topic areas in the target language after researching using a variety of target culture media.
- 5. Students write summaries and persuasive essays based on target culture media as well as their own perspectives.
- 6. Students write business style emails on topic areas.
