Congratulations to our boys soccer program who made the district playoffs for the first time in 8 seasons!

Congratulations to all of our track and field athletes that competed at districts.

Special congratulations to Anouthai Vongphet! He qualified for state in the long jump with a jump of 22 feet, 6 inches. Congratulations to our boys 4 x 100 and 4 x 400 relay teams who both qualified for the state meet!

Congratulations to our softball team for finishing 2nd in Wesco with a 14-6 regular season record! On May 17th the team clinched a state berth with a thrilling come-from-behind 14-12 win over Arlington, and on May 19th they won the district championship beating Snohomish 14-7! After losing in the round of 16 at state, they battled back and had 2 come from behind victories to place in the top 8!

Congratulations to golfers Dane Henrikson and Bodie Williams who both earned a berth into the boys state golf tournament! Ty and Bodie will be the first boys golfers to compete in the state tournament since 2014.

Our athletes recently visited Eisenhower and Evergreen Middle School to promote our fall sports for our incoming 9th graders. We look forward to seeing our future Bruins on the athletic fields this fall!

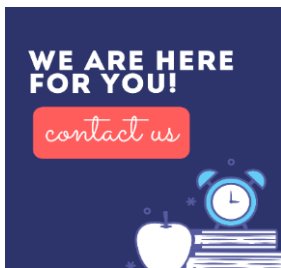
- 1. PLAY CHESS:** This game of strategy goes *way* back, and the creativity and critical thinking it requires explains why it never gets old.

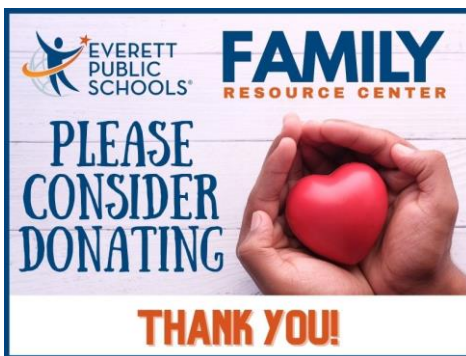

Everett School District's Homeless - KIT Program team recently opened the first [Family Resource Center](#) (FRC) in Hawthorne Elementary. Through a school referral process, they help the district's homeless families navigate the county's social service programs — which are spread across the school district, county agencies and dozens of nonprofits.

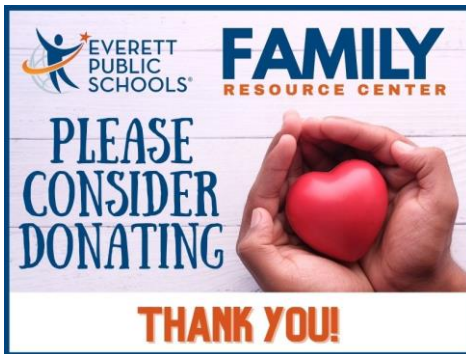
