## From the Principal

Dear Cascade Families,

Welcome to the 2022-23 school year! I hope this message finds you safe and healthy, and that you and your family experienced a positive, relaxing, and productive summer. As we start this school year, I hope you share in the optimism and excitement that I have. I believe that this is going to be a truly fantastic school year. That doesn't mean that we won't experience challenges, and as always it will be important this year that we continually work as a community to prioritize our togetherness, our connections, and our sense of positivity in support of our students. But as we've worked over this summer to prepare for this upcoming school year, I personally have encountered so many signs that have raised my expectations and left me feeling like we've got some crucial opportunities to make this year special.

I've found over the last few years that people often ask me about what Cascade's like, what our school culture is like, what our student body is like. I always mention one of my first impressions of this school community, which was that when asked, people more often than not spoke to how essential and successful our annual Food Drive is. At the time, I was struck by that, and came to learn that while at the heart of Cascade is pride, it is pride in being there for others, being of service and of support to any and all. It is these qualities that I believe make Cascade a truly special place and one of the best high schools in the state, a place I regularly reflect on how lucky and appreciative I am to get to work and lead. While much of our focus this year will be around making sure each and every student receives a positive school climate and classroom culture, and consistently engaging and supportive instruction every day, I'd like to start this year reflecting on and recognizing that the teamwork it takes to have one of the most significant and successful Food Drives in the region is also within our ability to impact other areas of our school. Our school's mission is to prepare each student to be college, career, and citizenship ready. How might we take what we do every year in the Food Drive and to better understand how we can work together to capitalize on the opportunities we have to better our school community? One of my favorite quotes to reflect on at the beginning of a school year is from Winston Churchill: "a pessimist sees the difficulty in every opportunity; an optimist sees the opportunity in every difficulty." The potential of each of our students and the opportunities that lay ahead of us this school year are truly exciting. This year I ask that we commit to the following actions in support of our students' success:

- *Be involved, ask questions, help find solutions* – As a parent of three school-age children (one in middle school, two in elementary) I can certainly relate to how hectic the school year can be. But strong partnership doesn't necessarily need to look one way. While I am asking our instructional staff to find ways to strengthen those relationships, I ask that you commit to do the same. As a school, we need more regular feedback from students and from parents about what is working and what isn't. Please don't feel shy this year to connect with your child's teacher or our support staff to find solutions to better support you, your child, and family.
- *Coming together* – One of the key elements of any effective community are the ways it comes together in celebration. Over the last eight years I've been at Cascade, I've watched annually as the community comes together both in support and in celebration. A key to our success this year will be supporting one another in triumph and in need.
- *Forming new connections* – This year many Cascade students will get involved in our larger community through extracurricular activities. Please prioritize this with your child. Again, involvement and engagement looks different to different people, but whether it is athletic teams, clubs, or curricular programs, research shows that involved students feel a stronger sense of community and belonging, and subsequently experience more academic success as well. # Construction on Casino Road



This school year our campus will be impacted by work being done to the State Route 526 overpass by the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT). The work will be seismic retrofitting the overpass to make the overpass safer in the case of seismic activity. This work will start likely this fall and carry on into the spring and will result in the closure of lanes of traffic

on E Casino Rd as well as our driveway closest to the overpass. East Casino will continue to be open, but please be aware that WSDOT will likely be using the center turn lane on E Casino to maintain two-way traffic during the seismic retrofit work. This will impact our traffic both coming to and leaving campus and will require extra caution as there will be WSDOT workers for this period of time. We've included some diagrams to help clarify where this work will be happening.

What happens on Arena Day?

- **School Pictures:**
  - Students will receive school picture packets during the first week of school
  - You can find more information regarding Dorian School Pictures within this newsletter (page 9 & 10)
  - Online pre-orders for school pictures are available **now** – [Dorian Photography On-Line Orders](#)
  - Payment to Dorian is separate from any payment to CHS – reference back of picture packet or order online
- **Opportunity for purchases during Arena Day:**
  - ASB Card - \$45
  - Yearbook - \$60 (with current ASB card) or \$70 (without current ASB card)
  - Student Parking Pass - \$25 (with current ASB card) or \$40 (without current ASB card). Completed [parking permit form](#) with copies of a driver's license and current insurance must be turned in at time of purchase. **Student must provide copies – office will not make copies for parking permits.**
  - Opportunity to pay any unpaid fines/fee from prior school years
  - Items can be purchased with cash, check, or credit card (*we will have credit card stations set-up during Arena Day*)
  - **If student has an unpaid fine/fee from current or prior school years, it must be paid to purchase a yearbook or parking permit**
- **Yearbook Prices and Sales Timeline:**
  - \$60 with current 2022-23 ASB card until October 7
  - All yearbook purchases after October 7 will be \$70, regardless of ASB status
  - Yearbook sales will reopen in January 23-February 3 and June 7-22

Students will be released for pictures during a class period. All students will receive a CHS ID card during Arena Day. If a student has purchased an ASB card the ID card will have the ASB notation on the card, if ASB is purchased after September 16<sup>th</sup>, then the Treasurer's office will place a sticker on the ID card.

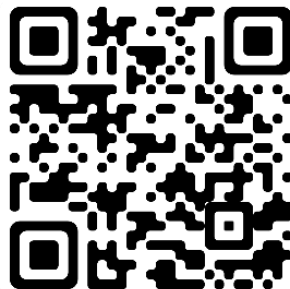

# AP 2022-23 AP Test Registration and Information

**Overview:** The Spring 2023 AP exams will cover the full content in each AP course. Students have the opportunity to receive college credit and/or placement. AP students should keep their options open by registering for the exam on time because there will be a \$40 fee for late orders. The College Board will support in-school testing in 2023 because administering exams in schools maximizes access and opportunity.

**Students:** You must create a College Board account. Students will need a College Board account to join their AP class section, receive AP assignments from teachers, get feedback on class progress, and register for AP exams (**Note: Parents/Guardians should not create an account for the student**). If you don't have a student account please click [here](#).

Already have a College Board account? All College Board programs are connected through one account. If you've created an account for AP, PSAT/NMSQT, or SAT, you only need username and password to log in.

## Fall 2022 – AP Registration

**Registration is a two-part process (Must complete both parts for each AP exam to be registered)**

- First, students will need to login to their College Board account (see above). Students will also need a “join code” given to them by their AP teacher in order to [join a class section](#). Once you've joined your class section, you will be able to [register for the AP exam](#) you want to take.
- Second, students will pay for their AP exam fees [online](#) or via the CHS Treasurer in the Main Office. (*If you need financial support, please do not hesitate to reach out to our school Treasurer at [knesci@everettsd.org](mailto:knesci@everettsd.org). Please do not let financial concerns inhibit you from registering.*)

**AP Fall Registration Goal Deadline: October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022**

**Final Deadline: November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Please ensure you have registered for your test by November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022.**

- It is recommended that students use their Everett SD email account when registering on College Board. Failure to use your Everett SD email account may cause a student to not get the correct AP exam.
- **AP exams cost \$97.00. \*\*\*AP Capstone (AP Seminar or AP Research) exams cost \$145.**
- **Any test ordered or canceled after the November 15<sup>th</sup> date will have a late exam fee of \$40 applied.**
- Any student who qualifies for Free & Reduced Lunch is eligible for a fee waiver and will not have to pay for an AP exam. \*\*\*You must have a current application for Free & Reduced Lunch completed through [Home Access](#).\*\*\*

**Late Registration Fee mandated by College Board: Any exams ordered after November 16<sup>th</sup> to March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023, 11:59pm**

- Students may register for an AP exam after November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and up until March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 but will have to **pay an additional \$40 per exam late order fee.** (*Note: This late fee cannot be waived in any circumstance.*)

**Dropping an AP class after ordering a test requires a \$40 cancelation fee that must be paid by student/family.**

# Nine Tips for High Schooler Parents

With a son in college and one heading into his senior year of high school, I marvel at how quickly the time slips by. Blink. That's how fast it is. As I talk to parents of teens with so many questions, and often frustrations, I want to share with them the lessons we sometimes only learn by making our way through things. **There's no magic wand to ensure that's it's all smooth sailing, but if I can impart a little advice from someone who has been there, and been through that – it would start with these nine things...**

1. **Be the sleep police.** Most teens are running on empty when it comes to sleep; but we all know they need sufficient shut-eye to think straight, make solid decisions, keep cool under pressure, and to enjoy the moments. While controlling how much sleep your teen actually gets is, well, an impossible dream –make sleep a priority in your house. Encourage early light-outs time for everyone in the family and have rules in place for the “sleep robber” – technology! Keep electronics out of kids' bedrooms after 9 PM for example and require devices to be charged in the common area. (Your teen may not like these rules – but remember, you own the technology and it's your job to establish the boundaries.)
2. **Don't discount their stress.** In today's world, high schoolers are under more stress than ever - getting good grades, excelling at sports, preparing for SAT's, part-time jobs, building their college “resume” (which starts as a freshman), steering clear of bullies, trying to have a social life and meeting *your* expectations. Sometimes a snippy remark or rolled eyes is a sign that your teen is overwhelmed. Seek to understand what's going on below the surface and don't take everything personally. 99.5% of the time it's not about you. Be the sounding board and safe haven for the stress of high school life.
3. **Listen more than you lecture.** Like any of us, kids just want to be heard. They want to know that we “get them.” That we're listening. Be aware of how much time you spend “ordering, correcting or directing” (a guaranteed recipe for power struggles) and instead, spend more time listening and understanding. There are times when you'll have to sit down and have the difficult conversations – but MOST of the time, they just need you to be that place to land, the ear to bend, and the rudder that keeps them on the right course.
4. **Don't sweat all the small stuff.** Bed's not made? Room's a mess? Towel lying on the bathroom floor AGAIN? Yeah, I know. It can be irritating, because if you've told them once you've told them a hundred times, right? So, tell them again if you must but please, please don't sweat the little stuff. Pretty soon they'll be out on their own and you'll miss them. Wet towels, ruffled bedsheets and all. (Yes, this is an actual room in my house!)
 
5. **Go to every event.** Every single one that you can. They want and need your support. Even though they may not say it, they love to see the wonder and pride you feel as you watch your teen flourish and create their own accomplishments. Be there for those moments. Celebrate who they are. Let them know you are their biggest fan.
6. **Spend one-on-one time with them as often as you can.** Even though they are teens and are biologically wired to “individualize” – your kids still crave emotional connection with you. Spend one-on-one time with them on a daily basis if possible. (I call this *Mind, Body and Soul Time*.) Be fully present – no distractions and do *whatever they want to do* - maybe shooting hoops, watching funny YouTube videos, taking a bike ride or yes, even playing video games. You'll both love the connection time and it will work wonders in making your teen more cooperative at other times. Score!
 



7. **Push them out of their comfort zones.** The middle school years are tough territory and for many kids - it's all about surviving. Most kids play it safe and try to stay under the radar. High school is different. It's the time for kids to figure out who they are and explore their passions. Give your kids the encouraging nudge to try something new – whether it's in the arts, sports, volunteering - anything that sparks their interest. My husband gave my son - a life-long soccer player - a nudge (push!) to join the choir for his freshman year of high school. A year later he was singing and dancing in his first school musical and a year after that, he earned the male lead role of "Bert" in Mary Poppins. Now, singing is his #1 passion. You never know what will happen when they try something new.



8. **Create a “Decision-Rich Environment.”** This is one of the tools I talk about in my new book, [\*The “Me, Me, Me” Epidemic - A Step-by-Step Guide to Raising Capable, Grateful Kids in an Over-Entitled World\*](#). High school is the time to learn *how* to make decisions and do for themselves. Create as many opportunities as possible for them to make decisions – from which hotel to stay in on vacation (within your budget) to which classes to take to how to get the best financial return on their summer job money. The more practice they have making little decisions, the better they'll do making decisions when the stakes are much higher. But – be prepared. Your kids will make poor decisions along the way – and that's okay. Create a safe environment where mistakes and failures are what they are – opportunities to learn.
9. **It will work out.** Whatever it is. Breathe. Here's the thing – nothing lasts, not the good or the bad - so don't wrap every emotion and anxiety up in the problems. And please, don't try to control it all – because you can't. Your kids will make their own way. There will be missteps and consequences and lessons learned. They'll find the right path. They'll be just fine. That old saying, “Let go and let God” is powerful – because it works.

Enjoy these times – yet be prepared (with tissues). Know that there will be a lot of “lasts” in that final year of high school. Last games, last performances, last awards ceremony, and last dances. It's a time for celebration. Recognize your hard work all these years has resulted in a capable and responsible young man or woman heading out into the world! That's something to feel proud of!

## Big changes with school meals for 2022-23



There are big changes happening with school meals for the 2022-23 school year that are important for you to understand. As we continue to return to ‘normal,’ the USDA is no longer able to extend the ‘free meals for all’ waiver we have appreciated the last two school years.

However, our state recently passed a new bill that eases the transition, called the Community Eligibility Provision, or CEP for short. CEP is a free meal service option for schools and school districts who have a 40 percent or higher number of students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.

Everett Public Schools worked hard to group the largest number of schools possible that kept the average percentage above the program threshold and because of this, 18 of our schools qualify for this program, including our school.

This means that breakfast and lunches are free to all students at these schools, regardless of free and reduced lunch qualifications. Families at these schools will fill out a household income report, which has been emailed directly to you, in place of the free and reduced lunch application. This report is important to provide students access to free waivers and other services.

We are so excited to be able to use this new program to offer free meals to the students in our district who may need some extra support and to all of our students, no matter where they learn, we will continue to offer nutritious and delicious meals that include seasonal fresh fruits and vegetables, scratch-made whole grain foods and lean proteins, with vegetarian and gluten free options too.

There has never been a better time to eat school meals. We look forward to serving you soon.

## Community Transit free to youth 18 and under

Starting September 1, youth 18 and under can ride all Community Transit services for free. That includes buses, DART paratransit service and vanpools (if they belong to a vanpool). Teens aged 13-18 are strongly encouraged to get a Youth ORCA card to use for fare “payment.” Community Transit will be providing them at our high schools before school starts and middle schools when they get further shipments. ## ECEAP preschool accepting applications for 2022-23

Everett Public Schools Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a FREE preschool program for three- and four-year-old children from families with limited income. ECEAP prepares children for kindergarten and provides family support and health and nutrition services. It is funded by the Washington State Department of Children, Youth and Families.



The six ECEAP sites within our school district are Cedar Wood, Hawthorne, Jackson, Lowell, Madison, and Silver Lake elementary schools. We have both school-day classroom schedules and half-day (AM and PM) classroom schedules, depending on the school location. Space is limited – apply early! ## Kids in Transition program



Kids in Transition (KIT) program supports students who qualify for two federal programs which provide support for children and youth whose housing is highly mobile: those who meet the more inclusive definition of homeless under the federal [McKinney-Vento Homeless Act](#) and those who are eligible for [Foster Care Education support](#).

Students who are in foster care placement (where a child welfare agency has placement, care and authority) or those who are without a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence may qualify for this additional support.





The KIT program works to eliminate barriers to students’ academic success and extra-curricular involvement. We ensure eligible students have access to free school meals, school supplies and uniforms. KIT may help students access extended day or summer school classes or coordinate access to additional academic support or tutoring when needed. The KIT Program may also cover, or coordinate waivers for, fees required to take part in activities such as school-sponsored sports, clubs, and required class fees. KIT can also help set up transportation for eligible students to maintain school stability, as long as the commute is feasible and in the best interest of the student. We also partner with the Family Resource Center and other community agencies to connect families and students to resources as needed.

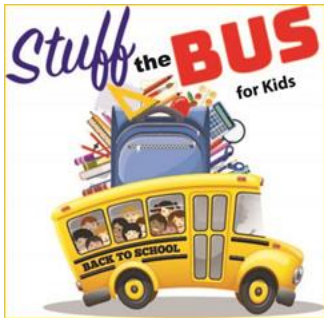

El programa Kids in Transition (KIT) brinda apoyo a los alumnos que califican para dos programas federales que brindan apoyo a niños y jóvenes con viviendas de alta movilidad: aquellos que cumplen con la definición más inclusiva de sin hogar conforme a la [Ley de Asistencia a Personas sin Hogar McKinney-Vento](#) federal y los que califican para [apoyo para Educación de Hogar Sustituto](#).



Los alumnos en hogares sustitutos (en los que una agencia de bienestar infantil cuenta con autoridad y está a cargo de los cuidados) o aquellos que no tienen una residencia nocturna fija, regular y adecuada pueden calificar para este apoyo adicional.

El objetivo del programa KIT es eliminar los obstáculos para el éxito académico y la participación en actividades extracurriculares de los alumnos. Nos aseguramos de que los alumnos que califican tienen acceso a comidas, materiales y uniformes escolares gratuitos. El programa KIT puede ayudar a los alumnos a acceder a clases de jornada extendida o de escuela de verano o coordinar el acceso a apoyo académico o clases de apoyo adicionales cuando sea necesario. El programa KIT también puede cubrir o coordinar exenciones de los cargos exigidos para participar en actividades tales como deportes patrocinados por la escuela, clubes y cargos por clases obligatorias. El programa KIT también puede contribuir a organizar el transporte para los alumnos que califican para mantener la estabilidad escolar, siempre y cuando el transporte sea viable y resulte la mejor opción para el alumno. También trabajamos en sociedad con el Centro de Recursos Familiares y otras agencias comunitarias para vincular a las familias y alumnos con los recursos que necesitan.

El año pasado, las Escuelas Públicas de Everett brindaron servicios a más de 1,350 alumnos a través de nuestro apoyo con el programa KIT durante el año escolar.
