From the Principal

Dear Cascade Families,

Happy New Year! As we start 2024, we are excited for the positives that a new year promises and hope for a great start this January.

As we come back from Winter Break, we will have finished roughly 2/5 of our school year and will still have a little over 20 days left of our first semester to increase engagement and improve performance. Teachers are ready and available to help and provide support to students, but at this point of the year, it is important to not wait. Staff are often wanting to provide support, but what can be done gets exponentially limited the closer we get to the end of the semester. If your student is struggling, there is no better way to get help than to connect with your child's teachers as soon as possible to request support.

As we move into 2024, we have a few areas that we want to recognize and be aware of.

- One of the most important areas of school that has the highest connection to academic success is regular attendance, and this year we've seen improvements in this area, so thank you for helping us with that! There is still room to grow though, so we continue to ask for your support in making regular and on-time attendance a priority in the new year. Here's a brief illustration of the importance of consistent on-time attendance:
 - Missing just one (1) day a week over the course of a school year can add up to almost two months of instruction by the end of the year. The state defines "chronically absent" as missing only two (2) days per month, and while that perhaps doesn't feel massively consequential, it results in nearly a month of missed instruction over the course of a school year, nearly 10% of the school year. The impact can be compounded, in that if that patterns persists over the four years a student is in high school, it would lead to nearly a full semester of missed days.
 - Just missing part of class, i.e., being tardy, can also have a very similar impact to being absent in that things tend to add up. For example, just missing 15 minutes of instruction per day would add up to over an hour a week, roughly 1 day per month, 8-9 days over the course of a school year. And that's just 15 minutes out of class over the course of a whole day! Miss 30 minutes per day, and now you're closer to 2 and ½ hours a week, 2 days a month, and nearly 16-18 days over the course of a school year. When also considering that the beginnings and ends of classes tend to have some of the most important information (key directions, important reminders, announcements, etc.), being tardy can quietly have a significant impact on a student's success in a course.
 - Here are a few data points to share with you regarding this. First, roughly 40% of our student body has attended more than 95% of this school year, and of that group nearly 34 have all As and Bs in their classes. Conversely, roughly 20% of our student body has attended fewer than 80% of this school year, and of that group nearly 3/4 have at least one failing grade.
 - I share these points with you to illustrate simply how cumulatively impactful something like missing class can be, particularly when it becomes a pattern of behavior. I also think it's important to share how making small steps like eliminating daily tardies or extra trips to the bathroom or the occasional missed day can also have a significant and powerful effect on a student's capacity to have success.
- Part of our values and goals as a school and as a district revolve around preparing all students for life after high school and to that end, our staff members will be working hard in the new to help our seniors complete their FAFSA (applications will become available at the end of this calendar year) and submit their college applications. So if you a parent of senior, be on the lookout for those opportunities!
