From the Principal


Dear Bruin Families,

I hope this month's newsletter finds you well. Hopefully as we move into second semester, you are healthy and safe. First off, I am excited to report that our first few students arrived on campus for in-person support recently! With our district moving to Stage 2 of our learning models on January 19, a handful of students in our Life Skills program began coming to school. So far it has been so heartening and wonderful seeing them arrive on campus. Our building and our staff who work in or with that program have taken significant precautions to make this process as safe as can be, and even though we are still in a period of a high level of uncertainty, it has certainly represented a moment of hope and anticipation for what I think we all want, which is a springtime that brings us some positive progress. I will be updating you on any changes as we move along, but it is also important to stay up-to-date with the overall news of the district and what learning model we are in. Additionally, while it seems unbelievable, we are beginning the process of starting to plan for next school year. Over the next few weeks and months, we will be communicating with you regarding much of the busy work of spring, including course registration for the 2021-22 school year, updates to activities or sports, this spring's graduation planning, and more. And as we've grown accustomed to during these last 12 months, much of what happens will unfortunately depend on the state of this pandemic. It is on that note that I want to express my gratitude for all of you, for the entire Bruin community. This hasn't been easy. As I've told many of you in personal conversations, as a father of three children in elementary school, much of these last 12 months have been an exercise in working harder than we ever had to work in all areas of our lives, just to keep going, to keep moving forward. As we move into this spring, I have hope and I also recognize that like everything these last 12 months, it is hard to know what the future specifically brings. In that spirit, I ask that you best support your student with a few simple requests these next few months.

- Please keep talking about the importance of attendance every day; this is particularly hard right now as there are more barriers than ever, but regular engagement is so key to success.
- Help your student stay on top of their academic progress and seek help from teachers if necessary. Distance learning has made teachers have to completely reinvent the way they work with students, so if you're noticing your student struggle, we want to partner with you to figure out some solutions as soon as possible. - Reassure and encourage your student with every chance you get. Beginnings and ends of semesters are stressful times in a typical school year, but ultimately the more adults in our students' lives who can provide support and comfort can make a huge difference.

Exploration, Mentorship, and Internship Summer 2021 Program Offerings

Everett Public Schools is expanding the Career Link Program this summer to include opportunities for students in all grade levels, including incoming 9th Graders! We are excited to offer the following three summer courses, which all provide students an opportunity to learn about and work with local businesses. Each program is unique and allows students to complete one course or all three during their high school career.

Career Link – Exploration (.5 CTE Credit)

Geared Towards: Current 8th and 9th Graders

Structure: Virtual w/ synchronous zooms 2-3 times per week (6/28 - 8/5)

Description: Provides students a look at career opportunities in career clusters that are aligned with their abilities, interests and personalities to formulate academic and careers goals, while creating a plan for achievement of those goals through high school course and beyond planning. The 6-week summer course is focused on supporting in-coming freshman and current freshman with an intentional effort to recruit students who can benefit from additional guidance prior to entering high school. Special Education, EL, low income, and AVID students will especially benefit from this course.

Career Link – Mentorship (.5 CTE Credit)

Geared Towards: Current 10th and 11th Graders

Structure: Virtual w/ synchronous zooms 2-3 times per week (6/28 - 8/5)

Description: Provides students a look at career opportunities in career clusters that are aligned with their abilities, interests and personalities to formulate academic and careers goals, while creating a plan for achievement of those goals through high school course and beyond planning. Groups will work closely with a mentor to discuss solutions and ideas while applying problem problem-solving, collaboration, project management, human relations, presentation skills, and networking skills.

Career Link – Internship (.5 CTE Credit)

Geared Towards: Current 11th Graders

Structure: 90-hour in person job internship (days/times may vary)

Description: The Everett School District is partnered with the City of Everett to create the Everett Career Link program. The program serves to link local businesses with emerging local talent for a 90-hour summer internship. The program gives students a chance to “learn before they earn” by showing what it is like to work in a specific job or work environment while earning credit. The internship program is targeted towards current sophomores and juniors from all four high schools.

Foundations of Manufacturing Class

Although we are still in full-remote teaching, students in the Foundations of Manufacturing class are engaging in hands-on learning by building their own electric guitar. This project has recently been introduced to the program through a partnership with STEM Guitar Project, which provides kits and standards-based curriculum. This addition to the course helps students understand how math and science work together and build the components and create a fully-functional and playable guitar. The project is still in the early stages where students are cutting the headstock, sanding the body and deciding on finishing designs, but they will soon be learning how soldering, wiring, and tension makes music possible.

Foundations of Manufacturing is a new three-period-block class where juniors and seniors combine their English, Math and CTE credit into one course through a manufacturing lens. Although the primary curriculum is based on Boeing's CorePlus Aerospace curriculum, students also engage in other application-based projects such as guitar building, roller coaster design, CAD/CAM software, and catapult engineering. Mrs. Youngberg, Ms. Lau, and Mr. Smith teach this unique course which will continue to grow and expand in the next few years.
