Dear Cascade Families,

I am fortunate to have family living close and to spend time with them over Thanksgiving weekend. My family is one of the many parts of my life for which I am grateful. I am also truly grateful for the opportunity to work with the students, staff, and families at Cascade High School.

I find myself celebrating the amazing gifts of our staff in supporting our students and the community at Cascade. I am grateful for the professional and sensitive ways they support our students. I had a parent come to our school a couple of weeks ago who is new to our community. She shared that her student had struggled in a previous school, but truly feels like she is welcomed and cared for here. Her grades have improved and her demeanor is happier. This student gets up and gets ready for school each day, happy to come to Cascade. She belongs.

Our staff works at welcoming each child into our school, making each child feel like they belong and are important, challenging each student to do and to be their best, embracing those who are struggling and encouraging them to overcome the obstacles they face.

Our students are also a joy to be around each day. I had the opportunity to talk with a group of students researching school funding for their AP Seminar class. They were engaged and excited and believed they could make a difference in the world. It was a wonderful interaction, but only one of many I have each day with students.

Right now, our students are in the midst of the annual Cascade Food and Gift Drive. Each year they gather tens of thousands of food items, thousands of dollars, and hundreds of gifts to distribute to those in need in our community. We make efforts to involve every student and Link Crew and Leadership student support freshmen classes in their efforts to be involved. I am inspired by the sense of community and the belief of each of our students that they can and should be of service in the community.

I have also had numerous interactions with families and community members who support their own students, our greater Cascade community, and particularly those students in need of extra support. We have many students who face obstacles in their lives and I have seen amazing generosity from families who are reaching out to help. Seventy-five or more of the students who attend Cascade High School are students in transition. They do not have permanent housing. There is a group of parents who are working together to find ways to support these students while maintaining their privacy. These families believe, as I do, that each of our students will succeed with the right support. I'm grateful for the support this community provides to each young person in our midst.

As we continue to provide opportunities for students to excel in academics, athletics, the arts, and through service, we are also focusing on meeting their social and emotional needs. This is a community effort. Thank you for being a part of this community.



Attendance Policie,

Welcome to the 2017-2018 school year. Please read the information below outlining the CHS Attendance procedures.

1. <u>Written notes (paper) or an e-mail to chsattenddance@everettsd.org are required to</u> excuse a student's absence. You can also send a fax to (425) 385-6002 to excuse your student.

Upon arriving to school, late or leaving early students are required to sign in and sign out of the Attendance Office. If a student is late to school, even if it is during passing time or lunchtime, they are required to come to the Attendance Office to sign in and receive a pass to class.

Students are not permitted to leave school or meet a parent in the parking lot. For safety reasons, parents/guardians on record with the school must come into the Attendance Office to sign out their students.

If a student leaves school without permission and without signing out in the Attendance Office, their absences will remain **unexcused**.

Do NOT text or call your student during class to have them leave. Teachers do not allow students to leave unless the Attendance Office calls to authorize it.

2. <u>Students must turn in their notes to excuse previous absences, early dismissals, bus notes,</u> <u>written by a parent, by 10:00 a.m. in the morning</u>. If your student forgets to turn in their absence note, they are welcomed and encouraged to bring it the next morning.

3. <u>Notes must be turned in within 30 days after a student returns back to school</u>, not including holidays or weekends, in order to have the absence excused. Notes turned in past the 30-day timeframe will be accepted; however, the absence is not excused and will be coded with *LN* for *late note*.



4. <u>IF you receive a phone call saying your student was marked absent in a class</u> and they say to you, "I was there," please contact the teacher directly about this discrepancy or have your students stop by the attendance office for a pink Attendance Correction Request slip. The student will need to take care of this with the teacher who marked them absent. The teacher is the only one that can give permission to change an absence that is deemed a "mistake" as they are the only one who can verify if a student was in class, in the wrong seat or tardy. The 30 day policy or before 10:00 a.m. policy does not apply for fixing these mistakes.</u>

5. If your student is out of school <u>over 5 days due to illness, a doctor's note is required to excuse</u> <u>the absence</u>. Homework can be requested for students out sick over 3 days. Please be aware that we require 24 hour's notice to teachers for homework collection. You are welcome to email teachers directly to request schoolwork.

6. **<u>Pre-Arranged absence request:</u>** If your student is going to be out of school due to vacations, surgeries, tournaments, appointments, etc., a pre-arranged absence form is required. These forms are found on-line or in the attendance office. This must be filled out by the student and signed by all teachers along with parent/guardian. The Principal will review and consider all Pre-Arranged absence requests before approval.

7. **PLEASE know what time your student has lunch or is in a PE class.** It is *not possible to find your student during lunch and extremely difficult to find them during PE.* If you have to pick them up during either of these times, please send a note with your student asking for them to be dismissed at a specific time. Your student will bring that note to the attendance office before school begins to pick up a pass that will allow them to meet you at the attendance office at the time specified.

8. Please remember that if your student missed the bus, overslept or is running late, or had car trouble, the absence <u>WILL NOT</u> be excused.

9. <u>The following excuses are considered valid and acceptable per the Everett School District</u> <u>Attendance Policy:</u>

<u>Illness</u> <u>Appointment</u> <u>Funeral</u> <u>Emergency</u> <u>Religious Observance</u>
