From the Principal

Dear Cascade Families,

Sometimes staying involved with teenagers' education can be tricky. Teens are seeking more independence, but parent and family involvement is important for student success in school. Here are some ways you can be involved:

- Make time to talk about school. Many high school students spend a good
 portion of their day outside of their home, not just in classes, but in
 extracurricular activities, sports, jobs, and with their friends. But if you take
 time as often as possible to talk about what's going on at school, they will see
 that it is important to you. Be sure to ask questions that are open-ended. Car
 trips, mealtimes, and standing in line at the store are great times to have
 short, but meaningful conversations.
- Emphasize the importance of attendance. Help them see the importance of coming to school each day and participating. If they are struggling with attendance, contact their counselor or an administrator so we can help.
- Check their grades online and offer assistance if their grades are slipping. Help them by ensuring they have a quiet place and a regular time for studying each day. Don't hesitate to contact their teacher if you have questions or concerns.
- Students (grades 9-11) have recently registered for classes for the 2018-19 school year. Ask you student what classes they are planning to take. They can show you their course requests online. Talk to them about the importance of taking courses that challenge them as well as maintaining balance.
- Consider joining one of our parent organizations. Bruin Community Parents
 (BCP) meets the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the
 Cascade library. They are a support organization for the school and all our
 students and staff. Natural Leaders is an organization for parents who speak
 a language other than English at home. This group meets the second and
 fourth Wednesday of each month at 9:30 am at Cascade. Contact Conchita
 Chinchilla (cconchilla@everettsd.org) if you would like more information
 about our Natural Leaders.
- You are welcome to volunteer at Cascade! We are looking for parents to walk about during lunches, greet students, and to help us ensure student safety by having additional adult presence. If you are interested, please contact me directly (cwoods2@everettsd.org).
- If you have any concerns or are not sure how to help your student at school, please contact their teacher, counselor, or contact me and we will find a way to help.


the event of Quick Serve Restaurant Management earning a spot at Nationals and a \$140.00 scholarship.

Congratulations to all DECA students that competed and good luck to those moving on to Nationals is in Atlanta in April.








