From the Principal

Dear Cascade Families,

This is such a joyful time of year. Our seniors are getting ready to graduate and move on to college, apprenticeships, military service, and the workforce. Some will be traveling first, others will be staying close to home, but they are all headed for new adventures. I am excited for the seniors. I have enjoyed this class over the last four years and I look forward to hearing about the new chapters in their lives.

Our eighth graders, soon to be ninth graders at Cascade, are also experiencing an exciting transition as they prepare to become high school students. Our current ninth, tenth, and eleventh grade students are also going through transitions as they move closer to adulthood.

During these times of transitions, sometimes our children push us away and try to get us to believe they are doing just fine and don't need us to be involved anymore. But, that's not true. Whether your child will just be starting at Cascade in the fall or is a returning student, I'm asking you to stay involved in their lives and in their education. There are some specific ways you can become involved. Some of these suggestions require a bigger commitment than others, but all involvement is important and appreciated.

This summer, there is a way you can show your child that you want to be involved and you can show them that education is year-round. Students who will be coming to Cascade this fall have a summer reading assignment. I encourage you to read the book assigned to your child. Talk about it together. Have fun with it.

In the fall, there are numerous ways to connect to school:

- Volunteer one day a week to interact with our students at lunch, giving some students a positive adult with whom they can talk.
- Volunteer one or two days a week to act as a tutor in a math classroom, or our AVID classroom.
- Join one of our parent organizations:
 - Bruin Community Parents is a parent teacher organization made up of members who
 offer their time and creative energies to have a positive impact on students and staff.
 This group meets monthly, generally the second Wednesday of the month, at 7:00 pm
 in our school library.
 - Natural Leaders is an organization whose members serve as multi-cultural bridges between students, families, communities, and schools. This is an organization that supports parents whose first language is a language other than English in becoming active leaders in our school and community. This group has meetings the second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 9:30 am at Cascade. There is an evening meeting the 3rd Thursday of the month at 6:00 pm.
- Participate in a campus clean-up day once or twice or three times a year.
- Become involved in a booster organization that supports an athletic team, our band, or our choir.
- Volunteer to bring items for our food or clothing pantry once a month or as often as you wish. You may also volunteer to organize and stock the shelves of these important services.
- Volunteer once a month, or just once, to come to our Saturday Academy for students who want or need some extra time for school work in our library. You can tutor students, just be a listener, or you can help make them breakfast!
- If you are a computer programmer, consider volunteering in our Computer Science classes through the TEALS organization. Follow this link for more information.
- There are many other ways to become involved. You may have a tale



Stuff the Bus is coming!

A partnership coordinated by the Everett Public Schools Foundation with community organizations and businesses has become an annual effort to gather backpacks and school supplies to help our students in need start the year prepared. Last year, more than 1,900 students received backpacks filled with school supplies, and the Foundation has the same goal this year. Look for collection bins in businesses during the month of August and Durham buses parked outside local businesses **Aug. 17-19**. Each item collected helps prepare a student with the tools needed to learn.

Vaccinations for next year

Now is the time to plan for the vaccinations your child will need before he or she enrolls next fall. Students over the age of 11 entering 6th grade require one booster dose of Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccine before the first day of the 6th grade. Students entering high school require two varicella vaccines before the first day of high school. We encourage you to obtain these vaccinations this school year and report them to the school nurse or office staff at your child's school. We'll track that information in the school database, which will help you avoid getting calls and overdue letters in the fall.





SBA scores are coming soon

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) scores will be available for all families and students this summer in the online Home Access Center (HAC). Families will also receive a hard copy in September. Find tools for parents to understand those SBA scores on the <u>district</u> <u>assessment website</u>.
