Positive Behavior Interventions Systems (PBIS):

Our Viking Value for January is PERSEVERANCE. At school we will be working on goal setting as a way to practice perseverance. Students in grades 3-5 will apply this value to their math and ELA Interim Assessment Block (IAB) work in test talks with Mrs. Petersen, Mrs. Fleckenstein, and Ms. Farias. Students in grades K-5 will apply this value to goal-setting opportunities in their classroom including iReady goals, AR goals, DRA goals, and topic/unit test reflections. Ask your child about their goals! Here are some ways you can help your child practice perseverance at home.

- Teach perseverance by example. Try new things and let your child see you struggle and yet keep going. Share stories of when
 you didn't reach a goal the first time but kept going.
- 2. Provide challenging kid activities, not easily achieved. Everything your child tries shouldn't be easy.
- 3. Remember it's okay for your child to get frustrated sometimes.
- 4. Offer praise and encouragement for your child's strong effort.
- 5. Set realistic age-appropriate challenges.
