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on our students! Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school. Good attendance, starting in Kindergarten, will foster grow in high school, college, and in the workplace.

We are always looking for ways to improve our practice in order to support and inform families. We continue to offer **individual attendance conferences**. However, some of the new practices we have embraced include **weekly attendance meetings**, **group attendance conference** and **home visits**.

Weekly attendance meetings include the school counselor, the attendance clerk, and me (assistant principal). Our goal is to make note of students who are having recurring absenteeism. **Group attendance meetings** provide an opportunity for parents to discuss a student's absences and for us to share data about student success in relation to absenteeism. Additionally, the counselor, the teacher (when possible), and I will make home visits as a way to bridge the gap between school and home for students, families, and teachers.

The attendance rate is important because students are more likely to succeed in academics when they attend school consistently. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a student is frequently absent. As mentioned above, we want to have a positive connection with families and provide as much support as we can to ensure students are attending school.

## Stuff the Bus is coming!

A partnership coordinated by the Everett Public Schools Foundation with community organizations and businesses has become an annual effort to gather backpacks and school supplies to help our students in need start the year prepared. Last year, more than 1,900 students received backpacks filled with school supplies, and the Foundation has the same goal this year. Look for collection bins in businesses during the month of August and Durham buses parked outside local businesses Aug. 17-19. Each item collected helps prepare a student with the tools needed to learn.



## Vaccinations for next year

Now is the time to plan for the vaccinations your child will need before he or she enrolls next fall. Students over the age of 11 entering 6th grade require one booster dose of Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis) vaccine before the first day of the 6th grade. Students entering high school require two varicella vaccines before the first day of high school. We encourage you to obtain these vaccinations this school year and report them to the school nurse or office staff at your child's school. We'll track that information in the school database, which will help you avoid getting calls and overdue letters in the fall.



## SBA scores are coming soon

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) scores will be available for all families and students this summer in the online Home Access Center (HAC). Families will also receive a hard copy in September. Find tools for parents to understand those SBA scores on the <u>district</u> <u>assessment website</u>.
