COURSE DESCRIPTION

- This class will provide a worthwhile musical experience for students, regardless of individual skill or talent level.
- The semester will be divided between hands-on learning through drumming, and learning how music rooted in African rhythms made its way to America and evolved into Ragtime, Blues, Jazz, and eventually Rock & Roll.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED and WHAT IS PROVIDED:

- You will need a pencil and eraser.
- I will provide a music folder compliments of our local music vendor. "Folder Checks" will be part of your participation grade, where I will be checking any on-going work for this class.
- Folders will be stored in the folder-slot wall in our classroom.
- Each student will be assigned a folder number and will have their own slot.
- Instruments will be provided for in-class participation.

DESCRIPTION OF STANDARDS:

- Use of the Washington State Arts Standards in Music will be the basis of lessons and assessments. The Washington standards follow the National Core Arts Standards (NCAS) using the sequence of "Create-Perform-Respond-Connect", as a way for students to learn and apply their understandings to familiar and unfamiliar situations. - World Music Drumming as well as History of Rock and Roll music have these standards threaded throughout the curriculum and objectives.

GRADING SCALE:

50% Student demonstrates instruction in class, contributes to discussions, and remains respectful.

30% Written assignments

20% Quizzes and Tests

- Late assignments will be accepted if the student shows a process of refining their work and improving over time, however, please do not wait to turn all late work in during the last weeks of the semester. (as in a "cram session"). You will know the final date that I will accept late work.
- The pace of the class may vary considerably according to several factors including students' musical readiness, students' physical coordination, and students' readiness to work as a team
- Assessments include both student's physical demonstration of music skills and written work.
- Written assignments, quizzes, and tests will include expectations and grading rubric as assigned.

DAILY DEMONSTRATION OF MUSIC TECHNIQUE POINTS:

Each student will begin the semester with 300 points. Points may be deducted if a student has not met the described expectations in this table:

5-point deduction if not met	Student demonstrates music technique in class, contributes to discussions, and remains respectful of people, music, and cultures studied. Student works to improve music technique skills.
