Around the Corner: SBA/MSP Testing

Jefferson students in third, fourth, and fifth grades will begin this year's state-mandated Smarter Balanced Assessment testing the last week of April.

Each grade level will have three days of testing in English language arts (ELA) and two days of testing in math. Fifth-graders will also take the one-day Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science.

It's important to keep these tests in perspective. They are an important snapshot of how students are doing in relation to standards. However, they are just one of many measures we use to understand how students are doing so that we can plan how to help those who are struggling, and challenge those who are ready. We assess students all the time – whether informally, through observations and day-to-day student work, or formally, such as on unit tests.

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Although these tests are important, they should not be a source of anxiety for students. By teaching our district-adopted curriculum, which is aligned to the standards, and by helping students learn the format of the tests and how to use Chromebooks, our teachers ensure that students will feel ready!

The testing schedule is below; please mark your family calendars accordingly. Although we can provide make-up testing due to illness or emergency, we ask that students be here on time each day, and that you avoid scheduling medical appointments or other absences on testing days.

Families play an important role in helping students be successful each day. Here are some tips:

- Ensure that your child gets a good night’s sleep, and has a healthy breakfast that will keep them going all morning.
- Make sure your child gets to school on time. Walking in late can leave students feeling unsettled. No Tardy Taters – or TESTERS!
- Encourage your child to do their best, and validate that they are capable. After the test, praise them for their hard work and their perseverance.
- If your child is anxious, talk about self-calming strategies such as positive self-talk or taking deep breaths. If the child’s anxiety is especially high, please let the classroom teacher know so that we can provide additional support at school.

Important Reminders from the Jefferson Office

Checking a student out early: When checking your student out early, please remember to have photo ID. Please note: Release of students to emergency contacts in non-emergency situations **requires** the express consent of a guardian. Please send a note to school with your student or call the office prior to their dismissal. It is a parent/guardian's responsibility to notify emergency contacts that the school may contact them in the case of an emergency.

Vacation-related absences: If you are planning a vacation and your student will be missing school, please visit the office to fill out an absence request form. Please note: Per district policy, we may only excuse up to five days for vacation or travel-related absences per year.

Visitors and volunteers: Please remember to sign in and out of the office. A volunteer badge or visitor sticker must be worn and visible at all times.

Update your e-mail address with the office: Providing us with an up-to-date e-mail will help us keep you current on school news and relay information about your child.

Hello Jefferson Families! Another of the five components of fitness that we focus on during the school year is muscular endurance. Muscular endurance is when we move our muscles over and over (12 times or more), or when we hold a position for a long time without taking a break or stopping to rest. Some exercises that strengthen muscular endurance are burpees, plank poses, sit-ups, crab-walk, bicep curls, and wall sits. Muscular endurance can help us run for longer periods of time, help us to lift and carry things over and over, as well as prevent injuries by strengthening our bones.
