Hello, Jefferson families!

The instructional coaching team is very excited to connect with our new and returning Chargers and collaborate with teachers to provide the highest quality of instruction to every learner every day.

This year the Jefferson staff will be implementing a new model of instruction that aligns with evidencebased research on the most equitable strategies to support all students in meeting and exceeding grade level standards. As always, your child's teacher will provide the core, grade-level academic instruction to your student. The shift will be in how your child receives additional targeted academic support if it is needed. Rather than being pulled-out of the classroom to receive intervention services. your child's teacher will deliver the instruction in the classroom. While the classroom teacher works with flexible groups of students to close learning gaps, paraprofessionals will push-in to the classroom to support the class or small student groups with learning tasks specifically identified to further their own learning.

The coaching team is very excited to work collaboratively with teachers to identify individual student learning needs, co-plan lessons, and deliver targeted instruction to flexible groups of students. We look forward to seeing how a shift in our instructional practices improves outcomes for all learners.

News From the Music Room



Let's Connect



Safety reminders

As mornings become darker and darker, drivers, please keep an eye out for students walking and waiting at their bus stops. Families, please have your students wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the flashing lights and stop sign to be fully out before they cross the street. Here is great graphic showing when to stop for school buses, and if you are ever in doubt--STOP! Other safety reminders include:

- Students and parents should wait on the curb when waiting for the school bus, not off
 the curb or in the street.
- Do not stand in school crosswalks, obey crossing guards if present.
- Be focused and aware when walking in school parking lots. We encourage walkers to stay off their cell phones while walking. Dark mornings may make it difficult for drivers to see walkers.
- Bicyclist must abide by the same laws as drivers, which means they must stop for school buses when applicable.
- If possible, wear lighter clothing/coats or add something reflective on darker clothing.
