We've had a great first month of school here at Jefferson Elementary. Staff and students are settling into routines, and there is so much learning going on every day! It's a pleasure to be out and about in classrooms, seeing students hard at work, thinking deeply, and treating each other respectfully. Our classrooms are becoming true learning communities.

The implementation of our **positive behavior management program** based on the Charger Code is going really well. At this point in the year, students have been intentionally taught expected behaviors in areas around the school by the staff members who supervise them in those areas. We are positively reinforcing those behaviors with Thunder Tickets. We continue to teach students about how to reset when they are struggling with strong emotions that may keep them from accessing their learning, along with processes for reflecting upon and repairing choices that don't meet expectations. You can see more examples of graphics we are using in the Family Learning Night slide show being sent with this newsletter's e-mail.

I would like to take this opportunity to **thank our fantastic PTA** for their support in getting our school year off to a strong start. I'm especially grateful to our PTA for funding the online math learning program IXL for another year, and for supporting our community with the second year of the weekend food backpack program. Although there are two big food drives each year, donations are always welcome. If your family needs food assistance, please call the school and ask to speak with our counselor Lillian Ortiz-Self. I hope that everyone will support students and staff by joining the PTA!

Finally, as the weather changes, please have your child **dress to play** outside (jackets and shoes) each and every day, rain or shine!

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Important Safety Reminders from Assistant Principal Annette Sternberg

Here is information for you to know to help keep everyone safe:

- Our new front-door video intercom system is up and running. Thanks for your patience as we get used to it. The front doors will be unlocked between 8:45 and 9:20, and 3:30-4:00 (2:15-2:45 on Fridays), to make it easier for you to take care of office or other business.
- When parking in a handicap space, a valid state placard or license plate is required. We have several families who need these spaces on a regular basis.
- If you are staying after school with your child, please supervise them closely on the playground or field.
- Students riding bikes to/from school must wear a helmet, and walk bikes on paths and sidewalks. Scooters are not allowed, and only those in grades 3-5 may ride bikes unless a parent accompanies them.
- If you are dropping your child off late for school, please come into the office to sign them in.

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News from the Library



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Math Marvels by Stacy Roach, the Math Coach

In addition, *Marcus* in Mrs. Camp's class completed the entire math map from the Everett Public Schools summer math challenge, and he will receive a half-day as my math assistant with a special made-to-order lunch just for him!

Your student should also have brought home the first **Schoolwide Math Challenge**. Each one is accessible to students of every ability and grade level. For every monthly challenge, there will be multiple ways that students can solve and show their answers. Additionally, students exhibiting effort toward this activity will receive a raffle ticket for my Math-le Raff-le! Students in K-1 (or any student struggling to write) can have parents help them write the answers down. Kids at every grade level can receive assistance with the math challenge from parents, siblings, or friends ... as long as they make their best effort. **Tip:** Explain to your child that the word "challenge" does not always mean hard or beyond their ability. It may take longer and need more energy, but its rewards are also greater. I tell the students on my math team, "Walking a few steps isn't difficult, right? Walking around the field ten times still is not impossible or difficult. However, it is a challenge. It takes longer, and I may need to remember to drink water or stretch. Nevertheless, its rewards are greater. I feel invigorated; I get to see nature, etc." Happy solving!



PBIS – Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports – is Jefferson's framework for:

- Teaching students expected behaviors
- Recognizing students for demonstrating positive/desired behaviors
- Responding to behaviors that do not meet expectations









Behavioral errors most often occur because:

- Students do not have appropriate skills
- Students have not been taught skills, procedures, and routines in context

Discipline means "to teach."

Discipline offers skills that can change behavior.

Teaching Expected Behaviors





- Walking feet

- · Follow directions from all staff

Be Kind

- · Allow others to sit with you
- · Say please and thank you








You can support our positive school culture at home by:

Fifth-grade camp:

- Annual September tradition
- Team-building, outdoor education
- School event with fund-raising under PTA umbrella
- This year: \$16,500 budget
- About \$11,000 fund-raised
- Cost to families was \$55 per student
- Without fund-raising, cost would have been about \$175





Goals:

- Support school/home culture reading
- Raise money for both PTA and the camp program
- Reduce camp fund-raising "fatigue"
