News from the Learning Lab



This school year, we've shared our excitement around our new Illustrative Mathematics curriculum. We'd also like to share a little about the structure of the new

curriculum. Illustrative Mathematics is a problembased curriculum that provides academic rigor for all students in our K-5 classrooms. In a problem-based curriculum, students spend most of their time in the class working on carefully crafted and sequenced problems. The teacher's role is to help students understand problems, ask questions, and orchestrate discussions to clarify mathematical takeaways. Problem-based curriculum provides learners with a rich and lasting understanding of mathematical concepts and procedures as they construct knowledge and apply this knowledge to new situations. Students collaborate with their classmates. talking about math! They listen to the ideas of other students, justify their thinking, and critique the reasoning of others in increasingly constructive ways. Students are not only talking about math, but they are also gaining experience communicating ideas both verbally and in writing, and developing skills that will serve them in other academic areas.

This kind of instruction may look different from what you experienced in your own math education. Current research says that students need to be able to think flexibly in order to use mathematical skills in their lives. Over time, students gain the skills and the confidence to independently solve problems that they've never seen before.

Happy month of April, everyone! There has been a lot of learning in the gym! Transitional kindergarten students have been learning small-group stations and locomotor skills like gallop, slide and skip. Kindergarten, first, and second grade students have been learning recess games they can take outside and play with their friends. Third, fourth and fifth grades have revisited bone and skeletal health and are beginning to learn games that we will see during Jefferson's Field Day in June. Coming up, students will focus on exercise and activities that improve muscular strength and muscular endurance. Learning about the body will help children to make better choices to be healthy, happy, and safe.

Spring is officially here, which means longer days and hopefully a little better weather. Did you know that the CDC recommends that children ages 6 through 17 should get 60 minutes or more of heart-pumping physical activity each day for their body, brain and emotional health? This should be a balance of daily aerobic activity and activities that strengthen bones (like running or jumping) as well as exercise that build muscles (like climbing, lifting, and carrying weighted objects, or doing push-ups). No matter if the physical activity is inside or out, here's to a happy and healthy spring!
