

From the Principal

Welcome to the month of June! It's going to fly by – before we know it, another school year will have come to an end. We are celebrating having finished all of our state-required testing for students in Grades 3-5 last week. We are proud of the way students persevered to do their very best.

Our focus now remains on holding to consistent routines, as each day is full of learning opportunities. We also have some special events sprinkled in, such as field trips, field day, and the PTA Carnival on June 10.

As shared with you on May 20, I'm headed to Lowell Elementary as principal next year. I'm excited to announce that Steve Hopkins will be the **next Jefferson principal**. You can read his introductory letter on our [school website](#).

Here are some things to know as the school year winds down:

- **Library books:** Please return them ASAP!
- **Senior Walk:** If you have or know a graduating senior at any high school (including outside our district) who attended Jefferson, please encourage them to come at 1:20 p.m. June 15, in caps and gowns.
- **Device collection:** Later this month, we will be collecting Chromebooks and hotspots checked out over the last three years. For Grade 3-5, this means making sure Chromebooks and chargers are in classroom carts. For Grades K-2, this means sending in devices and chargers starting June 13. If your child is participating in summer school, they may keep their device until fall. District-owned Internet hotspots should also be returned unless needed for summer school use.

It is hard to believe that this is the last Jefferson Charger family newsletter that I'll write. I've loved my six years with you! This was my first principal job, and I've learned so much from our students, families, and staff. I'll never forget the Jefferson community, and I wish every single one of you the very best!

Hi, families! It has been a great year of learning at Jefferson. Teachers implemented best practices around the latest research in reading instruction and guided students through our new problem-based math

curriculum. In the month of May, students in Grades 3-5 completed the Smarter Balanced Assessments and related tasks. Students in Grades K-2 will finish out the school year by completing oral reading fluency assessments that target all they have learned in reading fundamentals – phonics and comprehension. It has been great to see all the growth that students have made in both reading and math, coming back from a year of remote or combined hybrid learning. We are very proud of all they have accomplished!

Parent engagement and innovation showcase



Please join us from 6 to 7 p.m. June at the Community Resource Center to learn from and engage with staff about two strategic plan innovations that will advance our

students' academic engagement. Join staff as they showcase new technologies integrated into our classrooms to improve student learning, such as flat panels and classroom sound enhancements, and learn and ask questions about parent supports such as:

Vaccinations for next year

Now is the time to plan for the vaccinations your child may need before they return next fall. We encourage you to obtain these vaccinations as soon as possible and provide documentation to your child's school health room staff. Providing this information before the new school year will help you avoid getting calls and letters as well as the potential exclusion from school in the fall. As a reminder, students entering 7th grade usually require a Tdap booster before they can start school. More information can be found on the district's [immunizations webpage](#).


Kindergarten registration

Family Resource Center

Everett Public Schools' Homeless - KIT Program team recently opened the first [Family Resource Center](#) (FRC) in Hawthorne Elementary. Through a school referral process, they help the district's homeless families navigate the county's social service programs — which are spread across the school district, county agencies and dozens of nonprofits. The FRC serves as a hub for a limited supply of donated basic needs items and provides a welcoming space for our students and families to receive support, have some basic needs met, and connect to school and community resources. The team has hopes to open a second center in the south end of the district in the fall. Please consider donating to help fill the shelves of the EPS Family Resource Center.
