From the Principal

As shared in recent Everett Public Schools [communication](#), we anticipate the **end of face mask mandates on March 11**, with masks becoming optional in schools and on school buses. In two cases, they will still be required: upon returning to school during days 6-10 of a COVID infection, and for 10 days after exposure to a positive case. After nearly two years of masking, this is a big change prompting a wide range of feelings in students, families, and staff. It's important that families talk about this with children, and help them understand your wishes as well as the expectation of being kind and respectful. Staff will be working with our students around the following key points:

- Mask-wearing is a personal choice, and is to be respected without comment, discussion, teasing, etc.
- Physical distancing will continue in various school settings.
- Other mitigation measures, such as hand-washing and extra cleaning, will continue.

News from the Gym

Hello Jefferson Students and Families! Happy month of March, everyone! As the days continue to grow longer with more daylight and better weather, outdoor activities are a great way for your student to get their heart pumping while getting fresh air! Now that we have turned the corner into the second semester in P.E., all grades continue to work on sportsmanship skills, while kindergarten, first- and second-grade students have been working on hand dribbling skills and third-, fourth- and fifth-grade students have been learning the basics of kickball and using a lead-up kick.

Speaking of the second semester, here are some helpful tips for reading the Health and Fitness Progress Report grade for “demonstrating competency in a variety of motor skills, movement patterns, and spatial awareness” from the first semester progress report:

1. This grade is in reference to the end of the school year and represents learning of 15 different skill areas that are taught and practiced from September to June.
2. If your student received a grade of 2 for this standard (“approaching performance expectations”), with significant progress of skills (grade of 3), they are on track and right where they should be in the first semester and we would expect your student to be at a 3 at the end of the second semester in June after all skills areas have been taught and practiced.
3. Given time in the second semester and remainder of the school year, students will have the time to learn, practice and perform all of the 15 outcomes in this Health and Fitness standard area.

News from the Learning Lab

We are looking forward to a great month of learning at Jefferson! Students and staff are reflecting on the first semester of the school year, and we are amazed to see so much academic growth across all grades.

Your child is benefiting from a systematic approach to reading instruction that is grounded in phonics and phonemic awareness. By the end of second grade, your student will have received instruction in mastering all 44 sounds! Once children have mastered phonics and can read grade-level texts fluently, they are able to focus more of their attention on understanding what they read. Here are some questions you can ask before, during, and after reading with your third-, fourth-, or fifth-grader to support with comprehension.

DISTRICT NEWS

Thank you, voters



Thank you to everyone who took the time to vote, and all those who volunteered to sign-wave and share the importance of the levies. The education levy is the second largest revenue source for Everett Public Schools, making up about 14% of the budgeted general fund. The renewal of the levy provides funding for the next four years. The capital levy provides funding for six years and makes up over 95% of the district's capital fund. As a

reminder, the district website has a [list of projects](#) that are able to be funded thanks to the capital levy.

Kindergarten registration begins this month



Do you have a child who will be 5 years old by Aug. 31, 2022? Registration begins on March 7. You can complete enrollment forms for kindergarten [online](#)! A [step-by-step parent walkthrough video](#) is also available as a resource.

Our district offers two choice programs that families may want to explore:

- **Lighthouse Elementary Cooperative:** Lighthouse Cooperative is a choice program within Everett Public Schools housed at Jefferson Elementary School. This K-5 program features standard district curriculum with an overlay of parent involvement via weekly classroom volunteering and support for enrichment activities such as field trips and parent-led specialty lessons. Classroom teachers and families work together weekly, building a strong community of students, families, and staff as children move through all six grades with the same classmates. - **Dual-language Spanish Immersion Program:** The dual-language Spanish immersion program at Emerson Elementary School is an option for fall 2022. Families with children entering kindergarten will have the option to choose the dual language strand. This program gives elementary students an opportunity to complete the Everett Public Schools curriculum in a nontraditional and exciting way by immersing them in Spanish language and culture from kindergarten through twelfth grade. Students in the program will become proficient in both Spanish and English while learning the same curriculum content as their peers outside the program.

For both programs, priority will be given to students within the host school attendance area. If a high number of students apply, a lottery will be conducted to select students, which may include those outside the host school and/or district attendance areas, depending on the number of applicants.

What is Lighthouse Elementary Cooperative?

Lighthouse Cooperative is a choice program within Everett Public Schools housed at Jefferson Elementary School. This K-5 program features standard district curriculum with an overlay of parent involvement via weekly classroom volunteering and support for enrichment activities such as field trips and parent-led specialty lessons. Classroom teachers and families work together weekly, building a strong community of students, families, and staff as children move through all six grades with the same classmates. Annual School Stakeholder Survey



To guide the Everett Public Schools' continuous improvement process, each year schools survey students, families, and staff. This information helps us to understand our specific strengths and challenges that impact school quality. The School Stakeholder Annual Survey is only one of many pieces of data analyzed by school leaders and staff. In addition to survey data, student achievement, attendance, discipline, and program data is evaluated to create School Improvement Plan goals. Students in grades 3-12 will be taking this survey in class. Families will also be invited to take the survey, which runs March 1 to April 1. Port Gardner Parent Partnership School (K-12)

Port Gardner is a parent partnership program where parents/guardians are the primary educators of their children. The program is a blend of on-site classes taught by certificated teachers and remote classes taught by parents/guardians in the home. On-site courses include both core academic areas and electives. High school level classes are credit-bearing and may be used towards earning a diploma through Everett Public Schools. Students enrolled in Port Gardner are public school students in an alternative public school program.
