

This game is great for color and shape recognition as well as counting, but for the more experienced player strategy comes into play. The goal is to earn as many points as possible during each turn. The highest scoring play is creating or finishing a "qwirkle." "Qwirkles" can be created by competing a row of all the same shape or all the same color. This becomes a challenge when everyone can play wherever they want on the board! We have played several rounds as a family this week.
