

Cliff Sijohn recounts that although the Coeur d'Alene tribe had signed treaties to protect what land and rights they had left, Congress had already planned to build a military road through the middle of Coeur d'Alene country. What might this say about the United States' views of the treaty agreement into which they were entering? How might this set the stage for conflict and war?

5. Was the territorial governor, Isaac Stevens, honest with the tribes about why the US wanted to enter into these treaty agreements? What were the reasons for entering these treaties?
